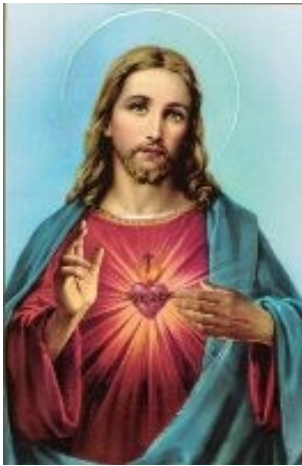

The Sacred Heart of Jesus Image:

In an Enthronement ceremony, a blessed picture or a statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is used. Any image is usable, as long as it replicates what St. Margaret Mary described seeing when Our Lord appeared to her:

- Around His Heart is a crown of thorns.
- There is a wound, from the soldier's spear, showing that our sins hurt Him in the Heart.
- The flames coming from His Heart show the intensity of His Love.
- Above the flames is a cross showing that His Love for us was so great that He died for us.
- These are the symbols of His passion. We were redeemed by the cross and we will be saved by it.

The following are only a few quotes and paraphrases in his video.

Msgr. John Esseff says, "The enthronement of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is not about having a picture in your homes, rather it is all about receiving Jesus into your hearts." ... "As Christians, we are to have a relationship with The Father, and that is what the enthronement is all about." "(25) At that time Jesus said in reply, "I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to the childlike."... "In Mt 11:25-27 Jesus says 'Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will. (27) All things have been handed over to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him.' "It is through Jesus that we can have a relationship with God our Father." In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, (21) so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. (22) And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, (23) I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me.' (John 17:20-23).

The enthronement of the Sacred Heart "is to present Jesus as the head of the family, our lives. Jesus wants to be head of the family, of father, mother, child," ... "Even if you are a single parent or a divorced parent, invite Jesus into your family" ... "whatever your family unit is." ...

"Jesus is knocking at the door of our hearts, wanting to come in, but He only can knock because He respects our free will. In the book of Rev 3:20, Jesus says, 'Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, [then] I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with me.' "Jesus wants to come into our hearts, and when we can unite our hearts with Jesus, then Jesus will come and have dinner with us, and stay with us now and forever. When Jesus enters our hearts, then the ego leaves." ... "This is too encourage you to open your hearts, to have that intimacy, that relationship with God, so that you can know and say 'I am the son of the Father', 'I am a daughter of God Most High', and then by the Power of the Holy Spirit we can begin to live our lives in union with Jesus Christ, trusting in The Father. Husband with wife, son or daughter with mother and father, brother with sister, we can then become a like Christ, a flaming arrow in a world of darkness."
