Be Reconciled to Your Brother:

The Gospel reading from last Thursday comes from Mt 5:20-22, and it is very much needed for us today. Jesus said to his disciples: "(20) For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. (21) "You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, 'You shall not kill; and whoever kills shall be liable to judgment.' (22) But I say to you that every one who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother shall be liable to the council, and whoever says, 'You fool!' shall be liable to the hell of fire. Jesus reminds us of the 5th Commandment telling us not to kill, or better said, "not to murder" otherwise we make ourselves responsible for the judgement to hell if we do not repent. Jesus warns us that anger towards others will make us responsible for the judgement of hell if we

do not repent. Why does Jesus tell us that "anger" makes us responsible for the judgement of condemnation to hell?

Anger and hate are the work of the devil, conversion is to turn away from the devil's evil ways towards God's Loving Ways. The disordered anger and hate of the devil are why he is a liar, thief and murderer, it is what hell is all about. The Catholic Church lists "anger" as one of the "Capitol Sins" or "Deadly Sins." The danger of "anger" is that it justifies evil words or actions because of some unjust intrusion into our lives or the lives of our loved ones. Beware of villainizing and demonizing one's opponents through deception and the distortion of facts. Such bitter criticism is called calumny because it is the devil's anger and hate at work in the individual. An angry and hate filled person rationalizes false conclusions and accusations by distorting facts, ignoring the good that a person does and focusing on the perceived evil even when there is no proof, while at the same time, predicting the worst catastrophic results in order to create enough fear among people toward their opponent until there is general anger and hate. St. John Chrysostom says, 'Imagine your anger to be a kind of wild beast, because it too has ferocious teeth and claws, and if you don't tame it, it will devastate all things. It not only hurts the body; it even corrupts the health of the soul, devouring, rending, tearing to pieces all its strength and making it useless for everything.

Jesus never used anger as an excuse to justify hostility or revenge. Many people want to use the anger response of Jesus in "The Cleansing of the Temple" to justify their anger, hostility and revenge. However, our anger is not "just" as God is "Just." God tells us of this through the prophet Isaiah: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways,' says the Lord. (9) 'As high as the heavens are above the earth. so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts." (Is 55:8-9) We are in the process of trying to become like Jesus through repentance and the forgiveness of our sins; that is called conversion to God.

Jesus tells us, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." (Jn 13:34) Which is to love and serve one another. Jesus never tells us to be angry, but to love, and there are NO EXCEPTIONS! Jesus endorses and fulfills the Ten Commandments of the Old Testament in Mt 5:17, and He gives us additional Commandments so that we can become true children of God by being virtuous and rejecting all the works of the devil by not committing vice/immoral and wicked behavior. When injustice and violence were inflicted upon Jesus, He did not respond with anger, rather, Jesus responded with The Power of His Love as God. While He was being humiliated and in terrible pain and suffering on the cross Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). This is what our response needs to be, whether toward friend or enemy. NO EXCEPTIONS! The only exceptions are when we refuse to do God's Will of loving and forgiving, and choose to do the devil's work of anger and hate. St. Paul tells us, 'Do not let the sunset on your anger' (Eph. 4:26) Paul is warning us not to let anger stew and brew in our hearts, lest it will give birth to hatred and rage, and then we do the evil works of the devil.

In St. Teresa of Calcutta's book "Total Surrender" she says, 'We all long for Heaven where God is, but we have it in our power to be in Heaven with Him right now; to be happy with him at this very moment. Being happy with Him now, means loving like He Loved; by helping like He helps, giving as He gives; serving as He served; rescuing as He rescues; being with Him 24 hours a day, touching Him in His distressing disquise.' Only through The Love and Humility of Jesus Christ are we able to acquire God's Love to be humble enough to recognize our sins and need for God's Mercy. It is through the reception of God's Amazing Love and Mercy in The Sacraments that we are able to find God's Infinite Love and Mercy active in us so that we can reveal God's forgiveness by loving our enemies and praying for our persecutors, rather than inflicting satan's anger and
