Other prayers follow, especially the act of consecration to the Sacred Heart. This is like a renewal of the covenant of love between God and His people: *"I will take you as my own people, and you shall have me as your God."* ~Ex 6:7 (or Jeremiah 30:22)

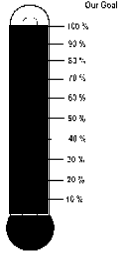
