First Friday Devotions:

From the Pastor Fridays. We remember that it was on a Friday that our Lord Jesus Christ made the ultimate sacrifice of love for us by Suffering and Dying for our sins/evil. "(W)hen they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs, but one of the soldiers thrust his lance into Jesus' side, and immediately blood and water flowed out." (Jn 19: 33-34). This is where

Jesus' Sacred Heart is opened for all who will repent and believe. Keep in mind that God's Divine Life is fully united to The Body of Jesus Christ, which means that as Jesus suffered in His Body, suffering entered into His Divine Nature where The Full Power of His Divine Love heals, restores and gives New Life. It is through The Blood of Christ, Who Is The Lamb of God, that Divine Love pours forth to us.


In the image of The Sacred Heart of Jesus, God The Father is trying to reveal His Infinite Love to us. "On the last and greatest day of the feast, Jesus stood up and exclaimed, 'Let anyone who thirsts come to me and drink. (38) Whoever believes in me, as scripture says: 'Rivers of living water will flow from within him.'" (John 7:37-38). The All-Powerful Divine Love and Mercy of God flows to all who repent and believe. It is The River of Divine Life giving Love that flows into the hearts of people to heal their wounded hearts and to recreate hardened hearts. It is for all who will ask for God's Infinite Grace and Mercy.

Jesus said to Margaret Mary Alocoque, "The all-powerful love of My Heart will grant to all those who shall receive Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die under my displeasure, nor without receiving their Sacraments; My heart shall be their assured refuge at that last hour." Repentance is the preparation of our hearts to receive The Most Holy Communion of God's Divine Love and Mercy. As Jesus Sacrificed His Life to us in obedience to God The Father's Loving Will, so our Lord Jesus calls us to make sacrifices of obedience and praise.

"The Nine Fridays must be made in honor of His Sacred Heart, meaning, practicing the devotion and having a great love of His Sacred Heart. They must be on the first Friday of the month for nine consecutive months, and Communion must be received.

With regard to this promise it may be remarked:



- 1) That our Lord required Communion to be received on a particular day chosen by Him;
- 2) That the nine Fridays must be consecutive;

3) That they must be made in honor of His Sacred Heart, which means that those who make the nine Fridays must practice the devotion and must have a great love for our Lord;
4) That our Lord does not say that those who make the nine Fridays will be dispensed from any of their obligations or from exercising the vigilance necessary to lead a good life and overcome temptation; rather He implicitly promises abundant graces to those who make the nine Fridays to help them to carry out these obligations and persevere to the end;
5) That perseverance in receiving Holy Communion for nine consecutive First Fridays helps the faithful to acquire the habit of frequent Communion, which our Lord eagerly desires;

6) That the practice of the nine Fridays is very pleasing to our Lord since He promises such great reward, and that all Catholics should endeavor to make the nine Fridays." (www.marypages.com/MargaretMaryAlacogue.htm)


