

The Word of God:

The apostle Paul tells us: "(11) I want you to know, brothers, that the gospel I preached is not something that man Postor made up. (12) I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it; rather, I received it by revelation from Jesus Christ." (Gal. 1:11-12) And in Rom 10:17 "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ." Jesus tells us: Mt 7:24 "(24) "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock." When we do what Jesus says, it changes our attitudes of sin, and we become Holy and do not sin anymore, "but" we must follow The Instruction of Jesus Christ. People go wrong because they use their human minds to figure things out, rather than turning to God's Grace and accepting and doing what Jesus says. People believe through the action of Jesus Christ. The Word of God allows you to understand what you believe. In Genesis 22:1-2, we hear about the testing of Abraham: "(1) Some time later God tested Abraham. He said to him, 'Abraham?' "Here I am," he replied. (2) Then God said, 'Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about." Abraham is told what to do, though it is an extremely difficult thing, and he sets out to do it. Remember, God did this to test Abraham's Faith to see if he would believe. "Thus faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ." (Rom 10:17) This refers to the New Testament through Jesus. Who speaks The Words of God The Father, and Faith comes from what Jesus says. James 2:14 "What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith but has not deeds? Can such faith save him?" Faith does not save until you do the Faith. Faith is when we know what God says, and belief is when we do what God says.

If you stay in pride; If you stay in avarice, which is extreme greed for wealth; If you stay in envy; If you stay in anger; If you stay in lust; If you stay in gluttony; If you stay in slothfulness/acedia. If you stay in these sins, then you stay unconverted, unchanged and you keep doing evil. These sins are the Capitol Sins, and all of them are mortal sins that create other sins in us if we stay in them. If we stay in sin, we act like atheists, and we lack the self-control that comes through the practice of our Faith, and we will die away from God because we did not seek the Saving Grace that God offers to us through Faith to be converted away from evil and become the Image and Likeness of God.

James 2:15-17 "(15) Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. (16) If one of you says to him, 'Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed,' but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it?" Jesus is telling us, if all we do is wish someone to stay warm and well fed, then you do nothing. (17) "In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action is dead." You will die if all you do is know what God says but do not do what God says. It is then that Faith means nothing to you. Jesus tells us this in another way, (41) "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. (42) For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, (43) I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me. (44) "They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?' (45) "He will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.' (46) Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life.' (Mt 25:41-46) Then in James 2:17-24 "(17) In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action is dead. (18) But someone will say, 'You have faith; I have deeds.' Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by what I do. (19) You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that— and shudder. (20) You foolish man, do you want evidence that faith without deeds is useless? (21) Was not our ancestor Abraham considered righteous for what he did when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? (22) You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did. (23) And the scripture was fulfilled that says, 'Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness,' and he was called God's friend. (24) You see that a person is justified by what he does and not by faith alone." Your faith is not based on what you think, but what Jesus said. God calls you to be free from sin, to be light and salt in the world. Use God's Words to help you. If you speak your opinion, people listen and forget, but if you speak God's Word then people are convicted and will be converted from evil ways to God's Ways. Here on earth we share in the sufferings of Jesus Christ. So during these 40 days of Lent, we are with Jesus during His 40 days of being tempted by the devil in the desert. Make every effort to stop sinning, get to confession and do good with love, because what you do, creates you to be who you are. Be like Jesus, and do what Jesus said, then great will your reward be in Heaven. Speak truth with Love, show Mercy to one another, do not worry and trust in The Infinite Love that God has for you and will give to you as you seek Him. What eye has not seen and ear has not heard nor have we even conceived what awaits those who love the Lord and are called to His purpose." (1 Cor 2:9) God's Purpose and Intention is to Save you from evil, and lead you to be like Him and to be with Him forever in Heaven. God Loves you, go to Him. -Fr. Doug Binsfeld




