just as Mass had ended. I already had these words written" (Divine Mercy in My Soul, paragraph #85) So often we do not understand The Divine Mercy of God because in our disordered human pride, we expect everything to go our way. God's Mercy is revealed in His free will choice to create each of us and bring us into existence in the time, place and circumstances that we are born into. God intends only good things for us, as He created our family members: our grandparents, parents, brothers, sisters, uncles, aunts and cousins. All people are created good, however, not all people remain good, as there are people who choose to reject God and to do evil. God saw all things before He created anything. During our life in this world, God is constantly trying to enter into our lives; however, in our disordered human pride we want "my way," rather than God's Way. When we do not get our way we get upset, angry and obstinate, and ask, "why doesn't God answer my prayers?" But we must ask ourselves; Are we asking God? or are we telling God what He should do? The latter is a far cry from Jesus' response when faced with suffering and difficulty as He said, 'not my will but thine' O' Lord. (Lk 22:42) God told St. Faustina, "I am the Lord in My essence and am immune to orders or needs." This is not God being aloof and uncaring, but God is letting us know that He is not under our control to be ordered around. And yet, God so Loved us that He sent His only Son to save us. It is in and through Jesus Christ that we are saved as we have every spiritual Blessing in Heaven given to us in The Sacraments.

God told us through the prophet Isaiah 55:8-9 "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways," says the Lord. (9) "As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts." There are many things that we cannot understand when it is explained to us. Faith requires us first and foremost to humble ourselves and accept what God tells us is right, good and just. Faith is to know what God says, and faith is necessary for us to come to conversion and believe. Belief is doing what God says. If we take God seriously and do what God says, then we will not say or do evil things and we will stop sinning; We will do good things with love; We will forgive one another; We will pray and not be afraid because we will believe in what Faith tells us, trusting that God Loves us and is with us and in us at all times even when evil things happen to us. When evil things happen to us in life, we become helpless to avoid or change the suffering at times. The suffering creates a degree of neediness in our life that can lead us to be humbled enough to pierce through our disordered human pride thinking that we are self-sufficient and can handle it on our own. Suffering can assist us to see how helpless we are in so many ways and thus teach us about ourselves. Suffering can reveal that which truly lies in our hearts, by observing the way we respond to the suffering/difficulty. And when we see our weaknesses, faults and failures, if our faith remains, we can run to Jesus, believing that He will forgive all of our sins in that Sacrament of Confession and restore us as sons and daughters of God The Father so that we can worthily receive Jesus in Holy Communion. Jesus tells us, "Ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened to you." (Mt 7:7) God is always present to us through Faith, Hope and Love. But!!!, that does not mean God does everything we want, rather, God will always do what we need. We need conversion from evil to obtain Holiness of life and Eternal Salvation. That is why God The Father out of Love for us humbly sent His only Begotten Son. Jesus, who is always obedient to The Father, became a man Who would suffer and die for us in order to give us every spiritual Blessing in the Heavens by The Grace and Power of The Holy Spirit, Who lives in each of one of us and will work through us, until we become The Image and Likeness of God. We can become a New and Marvelous Creation in and through Jesus Christ, if we choose The Good. Jesus tells us in Mk 10:18 that only God is Good. -Fr. Doug Binsfeld
