Today we celebrate the end of the Easter Season with the Feast of Pentecost. The Greek word 'Pentecost' has no significant meaning in and of itself, as it only refers to the number 50. As it has been 50 days since The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead to New Life on Easter Sunday. However, in Christianity, Pentecost is another very special day of remembering what God has done for us in giving us New Life of God in The Holy Spirit. Now God is not limited to being with us, but God can be within us through the practice of our Faith, Hope and Love.

Remember, that on this day the apostles were still so afraid that they were hiding behind locked doors and not yet openly practicing or professing their Faith in Jesus Christ. But when the Holy Spirit comes to rest on them in Tongues as of Fire, then The Fire of God's Love burns in their hearts, and they begin proclaiming The Glory of God and manifesting God's Love as Jesus had done. They begin to do what Jesus did and to speak what Jesus spoke, as Jesus was always obedient to The Father, doing only what He saw and heard The Father doing and saying.

Grace is the name that we give to The Divine Power of God's Love actively working in our lives and in the world. The Seven Gifts of The Holy Spirit are given to the apostles, and now they receive God's Gifts of Knowledge, Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Piety and Fear of the Lord. We also call these Gifts the 'habitual' or 'sanctifying' Graces, because they sanctify and change the nature of our habits. Our inner disposition is changed from love of self, others and things to Love of God. These changes in our human nature bring forth the fruits of The Holy Spirit actively working in our lives by freely seeking God more than all other people, things, and especially, ourselves. This occurs when we reject the benefits that the evils of vice offer to us, while striving to practice virtues of God's Life of Love by denying ourselves and making sacrifices to God for others. The traditional Twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit come from the letter of Paul to the Galatians 5:22-23: 'charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity." (Gal 5:22-23) These are called fruits, because just as a tree bears fruit, so we can bear the fruits of God's Life of Love within us by what we say and what we do. You will know a tree by the fruit it bears, and when we bear these fruits of The Holy Spirit, it is then that we manifest God's Ways of Love growing within us.

As our Love for God increases so does our desire to love people as God Loves them. It is then that we begin to receive the Charismatic Gifts of service. These Gifts do not reveal that we are special or good, but rather, they manifest our willingness to serve God by serving His people in order to build up the Kingdom of God on earth, which begins through the conversion of each person. Our Lord enables us to be able to have deeper levels of Faith, Hope and Love to receive and teach scripture, to prophesy, to heal, to do great deeds, to have visions, to have a word of knowledge, to speak in tongues, or to have the interpretation of tongues (1 Cor 12:7-12). These gifts are to be used only in our service to God in order to Glorify God; Not glorify ourselves and puff up our ego. Any Gift/s that we have are from The Holy Spirit in relationship with our willingness to serve God by allowing God to work in us and through us.

Do everything you can to strive for the greater spiritual gifts, and the greatest Gift is Love as the apostle Paul tells us. Ask The Holy Spirit into your life to help you to Love in The Ways that God Loves, and receive God's Gifts of Love to enable you to love in the ways that you are not yet able to love. But remember!!! Be patient with yourself and wait on the Lord! Do not excuse your inability and remain slothful, rather, continue to persevere in doing the Good Work of sharing God's Love and Mercy with those around you, and then we will make the world a better place beginning yourselves through Conversion to God's Ways of Love. I assure you, by doing this you will find rest for your soul, and the peace that the world does not give. God will give His Love to you. "Give and gifts will be given to you, a good measure, packed together, shaken down and overflowing, will be poured into your lap." (Lk 6:38) Trust in Jesus and all things will be possible for you. 
