Today is the feast of the Most Holy Trinity, which is the celebration of a revelation about This One God in Three Persons. When Jesus, Who is The Second Person of the Divine Trinity, came to earth, He informed us that The One God is Three Divine Persons; "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name-he will teach you everything and remind you of all that [I] told you." (Jn 14:26) In the Gospels, especially the Gospel of John chapters 14-17, Jesus tells us of His Oneness and His Equality with God The Father and God The Holy Spirit. In doing so, Jesus is telling us that The Father is distinct from Himself, and yet, The Father is the same as Himself, and that The Holy Spirit is distinct from The Father and Himself, but also the same as The Father and Himself, e.g.; Jesus told the apostle Philip, "Whoever has seen me, has seen The Father." (Jn 14:9) Jesus also said, "But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. (14) He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. (15) Everything that the Father has is mine;" (Jn 16:13-15)

The titles of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are not references to God working separately and individually as Creator, Savior, and Advocate, but rather, these terms indicate a relationship of The Three Divine Persons working in unity as One God. Jesus said, "Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own. The Father who dwells in me is doing his works." (Jn 14:10) The Divine Persons are distinct from one another, and yet they are not separated individuals with all kinds of differences; They are one in total Unity and Harmony. A simplicity in a complexity that is beyond human understanding in that One Divine Person does not diminish or lessen The Full Divine Nature in The Other Two Divine Persons as God. The Divine Persons do not divide The One Divine Nature into three parts, as in having a one third piece of the pie. The Three Divine Persons do not share in Power as God, because each has All Power. Each Divine Person is everything that it is to be God, which means: The Father is everything that it is to be God; The Son is everything that it is to be God; and The Holy Spirit is everything that it is to be God, with nothing lacking in the fullness of being God in anyone of The Divine Persons. Another reference of Jesus partaking in this Oneness of Divine Power occurs after Jesus rose from the dead, when He tells His apostles: "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit." (Mt 28:18-19) We see in this scripture verse that Jesus fully partakes in The Omnipotent Power and Authority of The One God. In addition, Jesus teaches us NOT to baptize in The Name of God, but in The Names of each Divine Person of This One Triune God.

The other amazing mystery about The Divine Trinity is that each Divine Person is totally united in thought and desire. There is no disagreement or opposition in their relationship with one another. HOW GREAT WOULD THAT BE IN OUR HUMAN NATURE!!! FULLY UNITED AND NO DISAGREEMENTS!!! God created the Catholic Church to be a reflection of The Unity of The Divine Trinity on earth, as well as, for married couples and their families to be a sign of God's Unity by living our Faith, Hope and Love in God. Unfortunately, the effects of sin have broken this harmony of unity in Faith. Hope and Love because of selfish motivations that divide humanity through evil words and actions, as well as, the refusal to love others by forgiving them.

Such a Trinitarian Unity of persons is beyond logical human reasoning, because it is so different from our understanding as human beings, who are distinct and separate individuals having agreement and disagreement in thoughts and feelings of what is right and wrong or good and evil. Whereas, God is a Perfect Harmony of Three Divine Persons making up One Divine Being in perfect harmony of Truth in Love. The idea of a Trinity of Persons may not go beyond human imagination, but I do NOT believe that Jesus and the apostles imagined it and then deceived us about the reality. I believe that Jesus Christ is The Way, The Truth and The Life of God. I believe in the apostles conversion to Jesus Christ and that they told us the Truth about God that was given to them by God Himself. The knowledge of The One God as a Trinity of Persons comes from The Divine Revelation of God given to us by the only One Who came down from Heaven; Jesus Christ; The Only Son of God; Who is The Second Person of this Divine Trinity God; Who became a man in order to teach us and show us a new way to live in relationship to God by The Power of The Holy Spirit. All of this is revealed to us in the New Testament of the Bible. Hence, the terms "Trinity," "Triune God" or "Trinitarian God" merely convey The Mystery of God's Oneness of Three Divine Persons in an Undivided Unity of Love. If you can fully understand The Mystery of The Trinity, then you are God, and would you please explain it to me. I speak of this Divine Mystery of God to help us to appreciate and understand that we don't know as much about God as we think we do, and that we have a long way to go in our own personal conversion to God's Ways of Truth and Love, but we are invited by The Father, through Jesus Christ in The Power of The Holy Spirit to enter into The Unity of God's Life of Love. 
