Feast of the Ascension occurs forty days after our Lord Jesus gave life back to His dead body at The Resurrection on Easter Sunday. The Ascension occurs every year on a Thursday, so it is called "Ascension Thursday", which was last Thursday. However, since many people were not attending this Holy Day of Obligation, all but 6 dioceses in the United States moved the obligation to the following Sunday so that more people would be in attendance and hear about it. Ascension Thursday is still a

Holy Day, but now, the celebration and the obligation is transferred to Sunday.

During the Easter Season, we remember that Jesus did not leave His physical human body dead in the grave, as we know with The Resurrection, nor did He leave His human body here on earth. Jesus took His human body with Him into Heaven, where His human body remains fully united to His Divine Nature.

God The Father has made it possible for every human person who believes to approach Him through The Powers of Faith, Hope and Love in order to prepare us to meet God after our physical human death and enter into His Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus told us, "I am the way, the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me." (Jn 14:16). Jesus opens for us The Only Path to Heaven, as Jesus opens His Divine Life to those who believe. Jesus did only what The Father was did (Jn 5:19-21; Jn 14:10-11, 31), by being obedient to The Will of God The Father because He Loved the Father more than Himself and more than all people or things. This Love enabled Him to serve The Father by relieving people of their spiritual sufferings through the teachings of Faith, Hope and Love by the forgiveness of their sins, and to relieve their bodily sufferings through miraculous healings.

Jesus Ascended into Heaven with His physical human body, and makes it possible for us to follow Him through faithful obedience to God our Father. The Feast of The Ascension is all about Jesus opening The Gates of Heaven to all Baptized human beings who turn away from evil and convert to God's Ways in the teachings of Faith, Hope and Love. Not only do we have access into Heaven, but we can become greater in Holiness than even the angels, as the apostle Paul tells us that "if we persevere we shall also reign with him." (2 Tim 2:12) Angels are all around God's Throne in Heaven, but Jesus, in His human nature sits on The Throne of God. This means that God The Father will allow human beings who believe to somehow and to some degree share in The Divine Glory and Honor of our Lord Jesus Christ in Heaven through all Eternity. St. Paul simply says: "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him," (1 Cor 2:9). Paul is telling us that no human being has thought of or even imaged the Glory and Honor that God has prepared for those who love Him.

Satan and the other demons envy and hate human beings not only because we are created in The Image and Likeness of God, but we are allowed to share in The Divine Life of God to a greater degree than the angels. IF!!!, we are obedient to all of God's 10 Commandments. The initial Gifts of Faith, Hope and Love are given to us when we are Baptized into The Divine Life of our Lord Jesus Christ, The Only Begotten Son of God. As we practice the Gifts of Faith, Hope and Love by learning about God, then we realize the evil of sin and are able to repent, and trust enough in Jesus' Infinite Love to ask for Divine Mercy in The Sacrament of Confession to be forgiven and fully restored as brothers and sister in Jesus Christ, which at the same time, restores us to the full status of adopted sons and daughters of God The Father Almighty. These privileged Gifts come through our Baptism into Jesus Christ. Then through His Divine Mercy, we can receive the next privilege, honor and blessing of being nourished with The Divine Life of God in The Most Holy Communion by receiving The most precious Body and Blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is in and through these Sacramental Graces that God shares every Spiritual Blessing in Heaven of Divine Life with us, so that one day, we may be fully converted into The Image and Likeness of God, which is The Wedding Garment without stain(sin) or wrinkle (Mt 22:11-14; Rev. 19:8) that is required of everyone to enter God's Wedding Banquet in Heaven. We are to become like Jesus Christ in His obedience to God The Father's Will in all things. Jesus tells us "ask and it will be given to you, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened to you." (Mt 7:7 or Lk 11:9) Practice your Faith, Hope and


