A little background on the prayer: "Litany of Humility"

The root of all evil is always found in pride that rebels against the Divine Will of God. The antidote is found in humility that accepts the Divine Will of God. The following 'Litany of Humility' was written by a humble priest, by the name of Raphael Merry del Val. He desired only to serve as a parish priest. However, he had great gifts of Faith, Hope, and Love that gave him great humility. His gifts of knowledge, wisdom and understanding became known through his academic studies, and he was called to be the secretary of state at the Vatican, and would have to deal with many militant atheist politicians of the day, who were very hostile toward the Catholic Church. Immediately upon receiving the assignment, he went to the pope and asked him to reconsider his decision and offer this position to someone else. Pope Leo XIII asked, Msgr. Merry del Val to perform this act of charity for the pope by accepting this position. "Merry del Val submitted and, without looking back, moved forward on the path that Providence had chosen for him. He would later comment, «When God calls us to do something for Him, it is proof of His confidence in us; we must respond faithfully and not betray Jesus' trust... We must accept on the spot, with complete obedience, the plans of Providence, seeing in it the Will of God. He knows better than we do what is good for us, and, He will provide, in an even greater grace, that which we seemed to be lacking.» He also counseled: «It is of no importance whether something pleases one or not. All that matters is to know that it is the Will of God, and to choose it... Let yourself to be led, from day to day, by the Lord with full trust in His Mercy and His Love for you..."

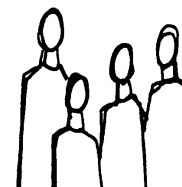
