Some people feel that they will compromise their Christian morality by voting for either of our candidates because they are so immoral, and prefer not to vote. Unfortunately, neither candidate is without sin and there is little chance that either will be canonized. However, the presidential election will influence Constitutional liberties.

especially, the Freedom of Religion, which will be further effected through the nomination of Supreme Court Justices, who will either support or oppress the God given morality as the foundation of The Constitution of the United States. The loss of Religious Freedom directly influences the right and dignity of human life that is taken away through abortion, embryonic stem cell research, cloning and euthanasia. The loss of Religious freedom adds to the demoralizing and redefining of marriage and removing God given standards of sexual restraint and decency which will add to the confusion of one's gender identity; The loss of Religious Freedom also limits the God given rights of parents in the raising and educating their children with God given moral values in our educational system. This list can go on, but to make the point brief, we need to be aware of politicians who support Christian moral values and those who support atheistic non-Christian moral values.

If we choose the candidate who opposes less God given moral virtues, then that is a good thing. If a candidate is willing to restrict but not eliminate abortion as opposed to the one who promotes abortion, then that is a better choice because it is a choice for a greater good. To vote for a candidate who promotes un-Christian policies, because you support them, and you reject a candidate who upholds Christian policies, is indeed sinful. The evil of abortion surpasses all of the other issues of evil, because without the right to life, you have no rights! So issues about insurance, immigration, racism, education, jobs, war and peace, etc..., all of these issues mean nothing to the people who do not have the right to life, because they are dead through a legalized free will choice to kill. If we do not have the right to life, then we do not have the right to pursue liberty or justice.

We need to elect politicians who base their thoughts and beliefs of good and evil on what God declares to be Good or evil. As the lines are being drawn more radically and clearly by the candidates, we clearly know which one upholds more policies that comply with God given morality or which one rejects God given morality. As candidates in our national elections impose greater consequence with regard to the Freedom of religion that permits us to live and practice God's Truths in our lives, we are faced with far more serious decisions that end up opposing God. If we reject God's Commands, then we reject God, and that is a deadly sin which brings eternal condemnation upon a soul, hence it is very important to know and understand what the candidate's policies are. Jesus informed us; "If you love me then you will keep my Commandments" (Jn 15:14), and "Woe to the world because of things that cause sin(((*evil*)))! Such things must come, but woe to the one through whom they come!" (Mt 18:7) I can only warn you to avoid intrinsically evil things that are greatly offensive to God and will separate us from God, but every person has the absolute freedom of conscience to choose good and reject evil or not. Always seek the Lord, "If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, pray, seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."


