


We have elected political leaders in the service of the common good for our nation, and now we do what our Lord tells us to do for them; "First of all, then, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, (2) for kings (((presidents))) and for all in authority, that we may lead a guiet and tranguil life in all devotion and dignity. (3) This is good and pleasing to God our savior, (4) who wills

everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim 2:1-2). The apostle Paul wrote this in a time when the political leaders were so extremely corrupted by evil that they were persecuting Christians, but the apostle Paul does what Jesus told us to do which is to "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." (Mt 5:44) Regardless of a politician's intentions and beliefs, whether president, statesmen or stateswomen, we are to pray for God's Blessings upon them, that they may be good leaders in the keeping of God's Commandments in the laws that they enact. It does not matter whether we agree or disagree with them; It is our duty and responsibility to remain faithful to our standard of beliefs as Catholic Christians by praying for all of our politicians that they may receive the Graces needed to deepen their conversion to God by an increase of Faith, Hope and Love of Jesus Christ that they may repent of sin and receive the Gifts of The Holy Spirit in order to acquire deeper levels of God's Knowledge, Wisdom and Understanding to enact laws that respect the freedom of religion so as to create peace in our nation and in our world. May they attain the virtues needed to govern our nation with The Truth that comes from God. Pray that they may have the Grace of humility to resist the many temptations of pride that come with being in positions of power and authority which can corrupt even the most well intentioned of people. Pray also for the people of our nation who do not have enough Faith to humbly accept things that do not go their way.

St. Peter warns us of the consequences of arrogance in 1 Peter 2:1-3, 13-17, or read the whole chapter which gives a more complete context, but these are all reasons why we pray for all people, especially, those in authority: "Therefore, rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind. (2) Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, (3) now that you have tasted that the Lord is good." ... "(13) Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme

authority, (14) or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. (15) For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish people. (16) Live as free people, but do not use your freedom as a cover-up for evil; live as God's slaves. Show proper respect to everyone, love the family of believers, fear God, honor the emperor." If you would like to hear further Words of God on this topic, the apostle Paul challenges us with even more forceful words in his letter to Fr. Doug Binsfeld the Romans 13:1-7.




