

Continue to pray to Our Lady of Fatima, as God has done great things through her, who is full of Grace. Mary was chosen by God The Father to bring Jesus Christ our Salvation to us. As with anything Holy, there is always the counter part of the devil present and at work. Shortly after the apparitions ended, the Free Masons tried to destroy the good work God had done at Fatima, and they tore down a wooden structure that had lamps and a cross on it, as well as, cutting down a tree that they thought was the holm oak tree where the Virgin Mary appeared, but they cut down the wrong tree. Later, when the first chapel was built, the Free Masons placed explosives in the chapel and around the holm oak tree. The blast in the chapel blew the roof off and severely cracked the walls, but the explosives laced around the holm oak tree did not detonate.

In every generation there are very good people, as well as, very evil people. Continue to pray as the angel taught the children: **‘My God, I believe, I adore, I hope, and I love You. I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope, and do not love You.’** After repeating this prayer three times the angel rose and said to us: **‘Pray in this way. The hearts of Jesus and Mary are ready to listen to you.’**


In the second visit of the angel: “Suddenly we saw the same angel near us. **‘What are you doing? You must pray! Pray! The hearts of Jesus and Mary have merciful designs for you. You must offer your prayers and sacrifices to God, the Most High.’** “But how are we to sacrifice?” I asked. **‘In every way you can offer sacrifice to God in reparation for the sins by which He is offended, and in supplication for sinners. In this way you will bring peace to our country, for I am its guardian angel, the Angel of Portugal. Above all, bear and accept with patience the sufferings God will send you.’**”

At the third visit by the angel: “The Angel leaves the chalice in the air, kneels near us and tells us to repeat three times: **‘Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly, and I offer You the Most Precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences by which He is offended. And by the infinite merits of His most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg the conversion of poor sinners.’**”

At the second apparition of the Virgin Mary; “I want you to continue saying the Rosary every day. And after each one of the mysteries, my children, I want you to pray in this way: O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fire of hell. Take all souls to heaven, especially those who are most in need. I want you to learn to read and write, and later I will tell you what else I want of you.” “Will you take us to heaven?” “Yes, I shall take Jacinta and Francisco soon, but you will remain a little longer, since Jesus wishes you to make me known and loved on earth. He wishes also for you to establish devotion in the world to my Immaculate Heart.” “Must I remain in the world alone?” **‘Not alone, my child, and you must not be sad. I will be with you always, and my Immaculate Heart will be your comfort and the way which will lead you to God.’”**

At the third apparition of the Virgin Mary: ‘I shall ask that on the First Saturday of every month Communions of reparation be made in atonement for the sins-of the world. If my wishes are fulfilled, Russia will be converted and there will be peace; if not, then Russia will spread her errors throughout the world, bringing new wars and persecution of the Church; the good will be martyred and the Holy Father will have much to suffer; certain nations will be annihilated. But in the end my Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me, and she will be converted, and the world will enjoy a period of peace. In Portugal the faith will always be preserved...”

Remember what Jesus said in Mt 18:3 “Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.” Jesus is speaking of obedient children who do not question but simply do what they are told with joy. This was the case with these three children. They accepted and did what they were told, and through their obedience much suffering came to them, but their souls were purified/perfected in Holiness as they practiced their Faith, Hope and Love in all circumstances. Obedience is difficult, but it brings great peace because obedience to God is the greatest sacrifice we can make, and The One that will bring us Salvation. *Fr. Doug Binsfeld*
