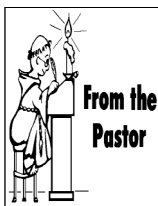

40 Days for Life:

It began with Catholics wanting to do more to defend life, through the power of prayer. This organization focuses on peaceful prayer and fasting asking for God's Grace in our lives, our communities, our nation and world. The idea of 40 days comes from the Sacred Scriptures: With Noah, it rained for 40 days and 40 nights destroying sinful people (Gn 7:4); Moses fasted 40 days on Mt Sinai and God gave him the 10 Commandments (Deut 9:9-12); Elijah travels 40 days through the desert and meets God and receives a mission (1 Kg 19:1-18); Jesus fasted 40 days and nights in the desert tempted by Satan and then begins His public ministry (Mt 4:1-11; Mark 1:9-13, Luke 4:1-13); There are 40 days from the resurrection of Jesus to the ascension of Jesus. (Acts 1:3). There are numerous other events associated with the number 40 throughout the Bible, but these are some of the main areas of trials and testings of Faith and obedience that brought about a greater Grace in the lives of people, especially, those of Faith in God.

The primary focus of The 40 Days for Life is to attain a greater respect for human life and an end to abortion through an awareness of the great dignity that God gives to each and every human person. But as Faith has diminished, we now find ourselves praying and fasting for the freedom of religion, as the Christian Faith is under many attacks in the news, in movies, on T.V., and in politics that seek to create negative attitudes toward the Christian Faith. These negative attacks over the past 3 decades have increased in number and tenor of harsh critical rhetoric, and have been effective in creating intolerance of religion. We see this in the civil laws of our nation and world that oppose God by making God given morality illegal in society. Such laws reflect the growing intolerance of God through the legitimization of the evils of sin, which will inevitably end with persecution of Christians.

I encourage you to pray the rosary each day for the greater respect of human life and religion. On Oct 7th, we celebrated the Feast of our Lady of the Rosary, which came about after the naval battle of Lepanto. In the year 1571, the Moors (Muslims) were advancing with a huge naval armada outnumbering the Christian navy. Pope Pius the 5th called for 40 days of praying the Rosary. When the day of battle occurred on Oct 5, 1571, the winds suddenly changed in favor of the Christian navy who had a decisive victory stopping the Muslim invasion.

When we pray, we NEVER pray for the death of anyone! We pray for the end of evil, as we engage in a spiritual battle to drive away and imprison the evil spirits that move human beings to evil words and actions. Bishop Oliver Dashi of Nigeria had a dream where Jesus offered him a sword: "As soon as I received the sword, it turned into a rosary," the bishop said, adding that Jesus then told him three times: "Boko Haram is gone." Boko Haram is a group of Muslim extremists. Bishop Dashi was praying for an end to the violence of Muslims killing the Christians, as the population of Catholics diminished from 350,000 to 50,000 in Nigeria. 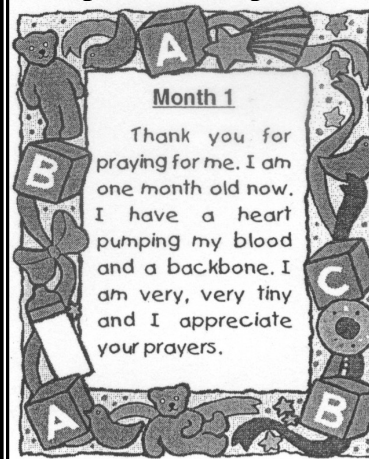

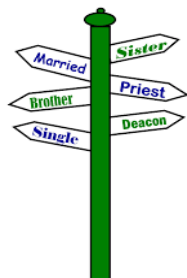
