What do you hear and what do you see?

Jesus tells us in the Gospel of Luke 12:1-5 "... when so many thousands of the multitude had gathered together that they trod upon one another, he began to say to his disciples first, 'Beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy. (2) Nothing is covered up that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. (3) Therefore whatever you have said in the dark shall be heard in the light, and what you have in private rooms shall be proclaimed upon the housetops. (4) I tell you my friends do not

whispered in private rooms shall be proclaimed upon the housetops. (4) I tell you, my friends, do not fear those who kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do. (5) But I will warn you whom to fear: fear him who, after he has killed, has power to cast into hell; yes, I tell you, fear him!"

What do you see and what do you hear Jesus telling you? What do you see and hear with our presidential candidates? Do you see and hear the corruption and injustice of evil that is being revealed about them. I personally dread to think what grotesquely horrific skeletons are yet to fall out of their closets before or after this election is over. At this point, either presidential candidate could potentially end up in jail because of any one of a number of serious allegations made against them if it were not so many corrupt people already covering for them. Neither of these candidates have enough Faith, Hope and Love to humble themselves and repent of their sins. That is why they continue to throw mud at each other. Now, they have thrown so much mud that they have dug a pit from which neither can escape from. The sexual predatory accusations against Donald Trump are the same accusations leveled against Bill Clinton, whom Hilary defended even to the point of attacking the character of the women who were sexually assaulted by her husband. Neither of these candidates can honestly go any further without already being guilty in some way or another of the things that they are accusing the other of. It is like a double checkmate in the game of chess, if that were possible where both players loose. The hypocrisy is absolutely stunning. If this issue were not so gravely abhorrent, it would be like a comedy mocking two people pointing out how dirty the other is without seeing their own filth. If either one of the candidates makes a mea culpa expressing sorrow with regard to the wrongful things they have done, it will be highly doubtful that either would have truly repented, though it could be possible. Rather, it will most likely be a strategy to appear to be a humble and contrite penitent to curry public favor and win the election. I can't help wondering, as there are "miss trials" in a court of law, can there be a "miss election" in our national elections so that we can do it over?

As the old saying goes, "O what tangled web we weave when we first practice to deceive." Do you see what happens when we do not live our Faith, Hope and Love of Jesus Christ by humbling ourselves and repenting of sin? We remain stuck in our arrogantly disordered pride that justifies every type of injustice and evil that we have committed in our past. In pride arrogance, we see only the faults of other people while remaining blind to our sins. Our Lord Jesus warns us about our secret sins, because one day all of our sins will be revealed, whether in this life or in the next, when we will stand before God and give an account of how we lived our life. Will we look any different than these two presidential candidates? Our Lord constantly tells us to repent of sin, so that when we stand before God, we will not find ourselves justly condemned to the fires of hell. Use The Grace of God that is being offered to you now in this life. Go to The Sacrament of Confession where you meet your Maker and Judge so that you can be forgiven by God Himself. Repent and believe in the Gospel! God wants to forgive us so that we will be in Heaven one day, but the unrepentant sinner will never ask to be forgiven and will not receive Divine Mercy. Now is the time of Mercy, now is the time to be forgiven by Jesus; Seek Him while he may be found.


