Canonization Process: From the

Pastor

As Mother Teresa of Calcutta was canonized last Sunday Sept. 6, 2016, there have been many questions about the Catholic Church's process canonization, as well as, detractors who seek only to criticize the sanctity/holiness of Mother Teresa.

The canonization process does **NOT** make a person a saint because making saints is what God does through our free will cooperation in His Grace. Canonization is the official Catholic Church acknowledgment of what is already publicly known of a person, such as Mother Teresa of Calcutta, who lived an extraordinary life of holiness. The Catholic Church applies Gospel standards of holiness as the criteria for holiness. The qualifications have changed somewhat over the centuries, and the last changes occurred in 1997, so the current process of beatification and canonization are as follows:

There is to be a 5 year waiting period after the death of the person. This is to allow for less emotionalism and greater objectivity in the evaluation process. However, the pope may dispense the 5 year waiting period in the case of a well known person's holiness of life, such as Mother Teresa. It is usually the bishop of the diocese where that person lived, who begins an investigation into that persons life. Witnesses testify to all that they observed of that individual: (theological virtues: faith, hope and charity, and the cardinal virtues: prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude, and others specific to his/her state in life.). All writings of that person are examined to determine anything heretical/against the faith to determine whether there is evidence of holiness of life. If the local bishop gives approval, then the documentation is sent to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, where another more extensive investigation occurs with a postulator general to promote the virtues of that person, and a vice-postulator or rather, the devil's advocate to raise objections and doubts of that person. After a thorough investigation both of these postulators present their case to 9 judges. There needs to be at least 6 affirmative votes for the case to be sent to bishops and cardinals, who are also members of the Congregation for the Cause of Saints. They must have a two-thirds majority vote for the case to be sent to the pope. The pope can then declare that the person "lived life with heroic virtue" and declare that person to be "venerable." Venerable is the title given to a person considered to be a servant of God.

The next step in the process is called 'Beatification,' which requires at least one substantiated miracle to have occurred from the intercessory prayer/s to that person to be beatified, or that person who is to be beatified had died a martyr's death, which means that person was killed because of his/her faithful belief in Jesus Christ.

After Beatification, there needs to be at least one more substantiated miracle to occur through the intercessory prayer of the beatified person. After this final substantiated miracle, the final Canonization ceremony of that person can be accomplished.

This process of canonization takes many years, as it has already been 20 years since the death of Mother Teresa of Calcutta. But the Catholic Church takes this very seriously and scrutinizes each individual intensely before declaring the holiness of an individual human being. The Catholic Church takes great care and concern in order to protect the integrity and importance of what we know as The Communion of Saints, who are worthy of the veneration that our Blessed Mother Mary received from the Arch Angel Gabriel "Hail full of Grace, The Lord is with you." (Lk 1:28)


