What is it to be Christian and to be saved?

Is it enough for us to say that I believe that Jesus Christ is The Only Begotten Son of God, From the Who suffered and died for my sins for us to be saved? Many Christians believe that is all that is required of us to be saved. But what does Jesus tell us in the Sacred Scriptures?

"In James 2:21-24 "Was not our father Abraham considered righteous for what he did when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? (22) You see that his faith and his actions

were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did. (23) And the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness,"[a] and he was called God's friend. (24) You see that a person is considered righteous by what they do and not by faith alone." (NIV) James is clarifying what he said in the previous verses 17-18 "In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. (18) But someone will say, 'You have faith; I have deeds.' Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds."

Do you understand that it is not enough for us to say we have Faith without doing what God Commands us to do. Our faith must lead to action, by carrying out God's Will. Remember in Gen 22, God tested Abraham's Faith to see if he would be obedient to God's Word. God did not allow Abraham to sacrifice his son, but God wanted to see if Abraham would be obedient to what God told him to do. Abraham believed and was obedient to God's Word.

"Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ." (Rom 10:17) This is telling us to listen to God's Word. "In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways. (2) but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe." (Heb 1:1-2) God The Father has spoken to us through His Son, that is why faith comes through hearing the message of Christ. God The Father told Jesus Christ to tell us His Final Words.

Faith comes from God telling you, and then, you do what God tells you to do. This is why Faith without deeds/works is dead, because when we do not believe, then we do not trust enough to act in the Ways that God tells us to act. What did God the Father say on the Mount of Transfiguration, "... 'This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!" (Mt 17:5)

Jesus says, "You have heard what was to people long ago, do not murder, (22) but I tell you that anyone who is anger is liable to judgement." (Mt 5:21-22) If we are listening to Jesus, he is telling us that anger is equal to murder and the judgement is the same. This why the Church teaches us to avoid The Seven Deadly Sins, and anger is the first. Next Jesus tells us, "You have heard it said not to commit adultery, but I tell you anyone who looks at a woman lustfully is the same as committing adultery" (Mt. 5:27 -28). That is why the Catholic Church teaches the 2nd Deadly Sin is called lust. Then Jesus says "Let your yes be yes, and your no be no. Anything else is from the devil." (Mt 5:37) Do not lie. In reality, only One Church teaches people not to sin, because the other churches teach that you are saved through Baptism and Faith alone. Because of this, people believe that Jesus saved me, so therefore I am saved, and they do not repent of sin and continue practicing sin. Most people today think they have Salvation already.

A long time ago, about 60-80 years ago, people would go to confession every week. Today people do not go to Confession because people do not do what Faith says, they follow what other people say. If you follow the Bible, then you see that Jesus wants us to do everything He says, "Therefore everyone who hear these words of mine, and put them into practice is like a wiseman. ... But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man" (Mt 7:24, 26) Jesus expects us to do deeds that true to God's Ways with Faith, Hope and Love our conversion and salvation." (Francis Hiranil) Fr. Doug Binsfeld
