Let's Lift Up Our Youth!

This weekend the youth of our parishes who have completed their preparation for the sacrament of confirmation will be confirmed by our Episcopal vicar, Father Gerard Petringa. Besides congratulating them I want to thank them for the way they have grown in faith and demonstrated their faith in action. In the coming issues of our parish bulletins I propose to start a Youth and Young Adult Column where we could learn more about what our young people are thinking and doing. This may include some notices about various activities which we are offering them such as our weekly Youth Group for high school students which you have read about in our bulletins. They meet every Tuesday and pray, talk and have fun while supporting one another.

It's not easy being a teenager or young adult today, and practicing your faith very openly. Thinking back upon my own teen and twenty something years, it was not terribly cool then to be known to hang around church. But there was more support then for the faith in our culture than there is today. I remember seeing public service ads on the MBTA urging families to attend services on Sunday. A popular slogan was 'the family that prays together, stays together. In fact this is more than a slogan. Families that I know in our parishes that make Mass and parish activities part of their life have strong ties that have helped them pull through some pretty difficult times with the loss of a parent or sibling, with the impact of bullying or harassment (including harassment about their faith), and with holding to Catholic moral values. One boy in our confirmation program, for instance, shared with me how his peers pressured him about having sex with his girlfriend. This kid, who is good looking, normal and has a steady girlfriend, was able to resist the taunts of his peers, thanks to what he learned at home. I thanked his mom when I saw her later. Her faith has made a difference in the life of her family even amid trials.

As part of completing their confirmation requirements, these students have an interview with me or Father Steven or another member of our staff. They tell some wonderful, edifying stories about what faith means to them and about the people who have inspired them to hold onto their Catholic faith. Often the people they look up to are their parents, grandparents (especially) or the person they chose as their confirmation sponsor. I wish I could tell you more but space here is limited and I also want to respect their privacy.

The point I want to make is that we shouldn't give up on our young people. The environment they grow up in is full of the lure of drugs, alcohol and sexual promiscuity. Working together we can offer them alternatives in the life of committed discipleship. Recently one of our teens who is very active at Saint John's and at St. Mary's High School in Lynn, Zach Stueve, was awarded the St. Timothy Award at a banquet for outstanding youth of the Boston Archdiocese. Being there was not only a source of joy and pride for us because of Zach but also an occasion to look around and see how many good kids our church is forming. We need to lift up our youth by providing the best opportunities for them in Catholic high schools, religious ed programs and youth ministry. We also need to let them be known and seen by others – other teens and adults – for the good Catholics they are and the good works they do.

As we create a place to get to know them here in our bulletins, I urge you to send me stories about the kids you know who are living the teachings and values of our faith. One such person is **David Connolly**, a senior at Bishop Fenwick High School. David offered to help our parish as a sacristan at Saint John's every Saturday. What began as a service project that he needed to do became something he then continued doing as a service to us. Every Saturday he prepares the church for the 4 PM Mass. He has learned a lot about the Mass and all that needs to be done to get the church ready for Mass. When I thanked him for all his service, he told me that he was happy to continue it but he is already looking for another student who might take it over when he leaves. How about that for faithful and thoughtful service? **Thank you, David!**
