Welcome to Church of the Annunciation

This weekend, as I announced at last weekend's Masses, is the kickoff for the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA), which invites the people of all parishes in the Kansas City - St. Joseph diocese to assist the bishop and the diocese with financial and spiritual support. The theme of this year's appeal is "The community of believers was of one heart and mind." Acts 4:32. Through our contributions, the diocese is able to serve people through social services, out-reach ministries, education and faith formation, family life office, respect life, vocation ministry, office of youth ministry, diaconate program, and many other ministries. The suggested goal for the Church of the Annunciation is \$23,775. This is an attainable goal for the parish if we all share in this effort.

We did not meet our goal last year, so hopefully more people will choose to participate in this year's appeal. Only around twenty- two percent of Annunciation parishioners participated last year. It was quite impressive to me that this small percentage of parishioners almost met last year's goal. Thank you to all who participated in last year's appeal. My hope is that more people will choose to participate this year. It is important that we all make an effort, even if you cannot afford much. If all five hundred households gave between ten and a hundred dollars we would easily meet the suggested goal. I encourage all of you to take a pledge card placed in the pew, or the one mailed to you, fill it out and mail it to the diocese. If you would rather have the parish office mail it, place it in the collection basket and it will be mailed to the diocese will send you a reminder whenever your pledge is due. Even if you do not want to contribute anything, just fill out the card and indicate that on the space provided. The Church of the Annunciation has always been generous and hopefully we can continue that tradition with this year's diocesan appeal. Again, thank you to all those who have been so generous in the past.
