

Dear Parishioners;

When we hear the title, "Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood," many of our childhood memories flashback to a pair of sneakers, a simple sweater, a smile and soothing voice that drew us ever closer to the black & white television screen, (the show was in color also).

Mr. Fred Rogers' legacy lives on for millions of young kids as his iconic, over 1000 episodes, television show is still a staple broadcast on PBS channels. One of his famous sweaters is enshrined in the Smithsonian National Museum of American History; the U.S. Postal Service has issued a stamp with his picture on it; and there's even a big studio biopic in the works starring everybody's favorite good guy, Tom Hanks.

Now days, we are in need of a kind witness to the ills of our culture. We are in need of frequent reminding that good will always prevail over bad actions and that we ought not to give up or give into negative forces that inevitably find their way into our daily lives. We have beautiful witnesses of the most important Person in our lives, namely, Jesus Christ. These witnesses are our teachers, administrators, staff, parents, priests, and especially in our students. Teaching our students is certainly a primary responsibility and role of our school system. Though we are called to do so much more than just teach. Each of us have a gift to share and this gift is the responsibility of passing on the faith, which is also a calling for each of us in our baptism. In a mysterious way, God works through our kind words and actions pointing towards a witness of Christ presence. We are in desperate need of this witness in our society today. For example, no matter what side of the political arena we find ourselves we are experiencing challenges in our country that is becoming more and more divisive and fractured. Many are calling for civility on all sides though their voices are being drowned out by competing viewpoints and agendas. Who is the next Mr. Rogers who will remind all of us to take a deep breath and breathe in the joy of life and exhale the gift of faith, hope and charity given to each of us?

Yes, the answer is right before us...it is as simple as looking within ourselves. We are the ones who will give the world it so desperate needs, the witness of God's unconditional love made manifest in the Son of God and poured forth into our hearts through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Mr. Rogers' name may be remembered among the annals of history as an example of kindness, encouragement to do good and the famous words, "Won't you be my neighbor?" Who is our neighbor? Who are we to one another? How does our faith call us to respond, react, and reflect the Person of Jesus in our daily lives? At our parishes and homes, Christ is the center and it is here that we find reason to celebrate life and pass that life God has given us along to the world around us.
