People of Gratitude: Over the last several months, I have often thought of Fr. Tom MacDonald's homily during our Lenten Parish Mission. Remember? Father Tom said that every prayer should start from a feeling, from a heart of gratitude. In that way, Father told us, we will be at peace. Why? Our lives will be marked by a Christ-like humility that has thankfulness as its gift. How easy it is to be thankful for the priests we have had minister to us in recent years: Fr. Driscoll, Fr. Mark, Fr. Riley, Fr. Tom, Fr. Charles, and presently Fr. Keith and Fr. Ren. Tuesday evening, I learned that Father Ren was being called to a new assignment: parochial vicar at the Collaborative of Saint Mary Parish and Saint John the Evangelist Parish in Chelmsford. It is a new collaborative that will begin in June. Each parish is substantially larger than either of our parishes (combined Sunday Mass attendance of 2136, 159 Funerals annually). As those parishes begin their collaborative journey, Father Ren will bring the positive experience and learnings of our beginning as the Christ Initiative to his new ministry at Saint Mary's and Saint John's. I hope that knowledge will make you all proud that the work we have been doing is being recognized and seen to be of essential help to another collaborative that will begin its work. I commend Fr. Ren for the generous way he has responded to this call to a new assignment. As priests, we know that no assignment is forever. We are ordained to serve wherever, and whenever, we receive the call. Change is not easy. For us, we need to keep in mind Fr Tom's encouragement to be a people of gratitude for having Fr Ren as a priest with us. For him, we are asked to pledge our prayers that this new beginning will be one of great joy and deepening service to God and God's people. On the weekend of June 13 / 14, we will have the opportunity to thank Father Ren for all that he has brought to our two parishes during this past year. Please join us after the 11:30am Mass on Sunday, June 14th, to thank for and wish him well as he begins this new moment in his life as a priest.

**New Beginning**: I couldn't have asked for a better community than The Christ Initiative to celebrate my first anniversary of priesthood this last weekend. This past year has been a sheer delight for me; you all have been patient with me as I learned how to be a priest, supportive of me in my ministry and in my growth, and an absolute pleasure to simply spend time with. I want to thank you all for being such a fantastic community to begin my priesthood with. For all of these reasons, and many more, it's with a heavy heart that I have to announce that the archdiocese has decided to re-locate me. The Cardinal often has to make difficult decisions in consideration of the larger landscape of the diocese and with a far-reaching view, and he has determined that the archdiocese would be better served with me in one of our newly formed collaboratives. So, as of June 15<sup>th</sup> I will begin as parochial vicar of the collaborative of St. Mary's and St. John the Evangelist in Chelmsford. This means my last day with The Christ Initiative will be the weekend of June 14<sup>th</sup>. I hope to be able to say good-bye to all of you personally between now and then. Please know how special you all are to me, and be assured of my constant prayers for you. Please pray for me, too. God bless you all. ~ Father Ren
