Lenten Mission, March 22,23,24 at 7:00 p.m. at St. Margaret's

Theme of the Mission: Savoring, Surrender, and Solidarity: A Lenten Path for Fullness.

The presenter of this year's mission is Dr. Nicki Verploegen.

Dr. Nicki Verploegen is Co-Founder of TATENDA International, a nonprofit which provides retreats and motivational instruction for caregivers and pastoral agents worldwide. For eight years she served as Director of Spiritual and Ministerial Development and Visiting Professor at Weston Jesuit School of Theology in Cambridge, Massachusetts and she has served as a visiting professor at graduate schools of theology in the USA including The College of Mount Saint Joseph in Cincinnati, OH, University of Dayton, and University of the Incarnate Word in San Antonio, Texas. She presently teaches in the Diaconate Formation Program and the Master's for Ministry Program for the Archdiocese of Boston. Her academic degrees include: Ph.D. and M.A. Formative Spirituality from Duquesne University, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, M.A. Spiritual Theology from Gonzaga University, Spokane, Washington, and B.A. Political Science, Elementary Education, Religious Education from Carroll College, Helena, Montana.

Personal Information:

Originally from Montana, Dr. Verploegen has traveled on private pilgrimage throughout the US, Japan, Indonesia, Tanzania, and Liberia (1984), exploring creative cultural approaches to contemplative spiritual life. Most recently, she conducted retreats in Zimbabwe, Kenya, and Bangladesh, and Jamaica with TATENDA International. She has been conducting retreats for over 25 years and giving spiritual direction since 1983, as well as being involved in liturgical ministries as a dancer, cantor, and planner, as well as social outreach programs. Her most recent book is From Monks to Missionaries. Other books include Planning and Implementing Retreats: A Parish Handbook, (2002) and Organic Spirituality: A Sixfold Path for Contemplative Living, and Meditations With Merton, (1991) (1993) translated into Spanish (1997) and now with Wipf and Stock Publishers.

Lent is a time set aside to grow in our faith. Under the umbrella of Grow In Faith Together here are some of the upcoming events in Lent to put on your calendar.

Meager Meals

On the Friday nights during Lent, from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m. the Collaborative Outreach Committee will sponsor Meager Meals at Blessed Sacrament Parish in Saugus. One can arrive at any time during the hour and half. Beginning at 6:00 to 6:45 p.m. each Friday evening there will be kid activities related to Lent. At 6:30 p.m. each evening there will be a 10-15 minute adult presentation. Each Friday night, a different parish group will host the meal. In the spirit of fasting the meal will be simple but nourishing. Each person or family is asked to donate what it would have cost one to stay home and have dinner. The monies collected will go to two Saugus Food Pantries; Grace Ministries Church and United Parish Food Pantry.

Praying the Scriptures

Fr. Tim is offering another four-week program on Praying the Scriptures. This program is open to those who attended the Fall program as well as those who might like to experience praying the Scriptures.

In a book by Fr. James Martin, *Jesus, A Pilgrimage*, Fr. Martin states: "Twenty five years ago.....I was introduced to a marvelous way of praying popularized by St. Ignatius Loyola, the sixteenth-century founder of the Jesuits. This method of prayer goes by many names: Ignatian contemplation, imaginative prayer, and composition of place.

Ignatian contemplation encourages you to place yourself imaginatively in the scene from the Bible. For example if you're praying about Jesus and his disciples caught in a boat during a storm on the Sea of Galilee, you would try to imagine yourself on board with the disciples, and ask yourself several questions as a way of trying to place yourself in the scene

Questions like: Who do you see? What do you hear? What do you smell? What do you feel? What do you taste?

If interested in experiencing this you are invited to join Fr. Tim in St. Margaret's Hall from 7:00 p.m. to 8:p.m. on the following Thursday nights; March 19th, March 26th.

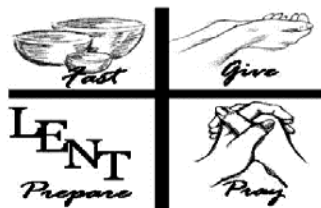

Guidelines for Fasting and Abstinence

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on those two days as well as all Fridays during Lent.

Fasting means partaking of only one full meal. Some food, not equaling another full meal, is permitted at the other two meal times.

Abstinence forbids eating of meat, not eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat. Abstinence does not include meat juices, and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, consommé, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies, as well as seasoning or condiments made from animal fat are not forbidden.

From the Pastor:

I remember last year when we had the gospel of the Transfiguration I was struck by the statement; “he was transfigured before them.” In sitting with that I wondered if the event were not as much a surprise to him as it was to Peter, James and John. I had always thought that it was a special gift to the apostles, something for them to hold onto. I thought Jesus did it to reassure them about who he was. In sitting with the statement, “he was transfigured before them,” I wondered if it were not only the Father’s gift to the apostles but also to Jesus. Remember at the baptism of Jesus it was the first time that Jesus heard the Father say that Jesus was his son. Following the baptism Jesus went into the desert for forty days to be with the Father. As he was in the desert he was tempted by the Devil. The temptations focused on his relationship with the Father. The Devil said “if you are the son of God then...” Jesus undoubtedly drew on what he had experienced in the desert and resisted the temptation. We hear that temptation again at the end of his earthly life when he is on the cross. The devil says through some bystanders, “if you are the Son of God save yourself.” It makes me wonder if that were not a common temptation in Jesus’ life. We see on the cross when he loses sight of the Father he feels the Father has abandoned him.

In the scripture we also recognize that Jesus gets tired and out of sorts and as a result he does things that are not typical of Jesus, such as turning the tables in the temple or cursing the fig tree. I wonder at times like these, when he is not focused, if he were also tempted with, if you are the Son of God then...”

It occurs to me, with all that is before Jesus, that the Father would want to reassure him of whom he was and would use something like the transfiguration to do that. He also chose to do it with three of his closest friends around him.

In the first reading from Genesis, we see the amazing faith that Abraham has in God. Abraham seemingly does something that few of us, or any of us could do. We see no struggle or even debate with God. Yet in the Incarnate Being, the embodiment of all of us, we see the struggle to do what God is asking. It was because of the different manifestations of God to the Son that Jesus was enabled to take the cross to Calvary.

Where does this leave us? God manifests himself to us in a variety of ways. Is he calling us to recognize these manifestations and draw upon them that we might be enabled to do as he asks and bring about the reality of his kingdom? During the season of Lent we are asked by the Father to change, we are called to a conversion of heart. It will not happen by itself. It can happen with God. Just as humanly impossible is the resurrection of the dead; with God all is possible, thus Easter Sunday.

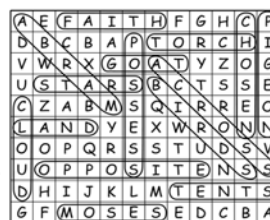
CROSSWORD

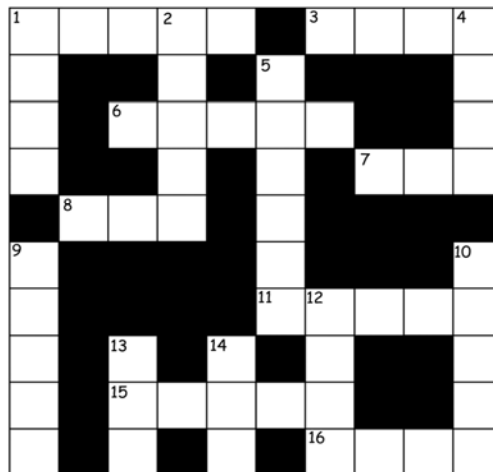

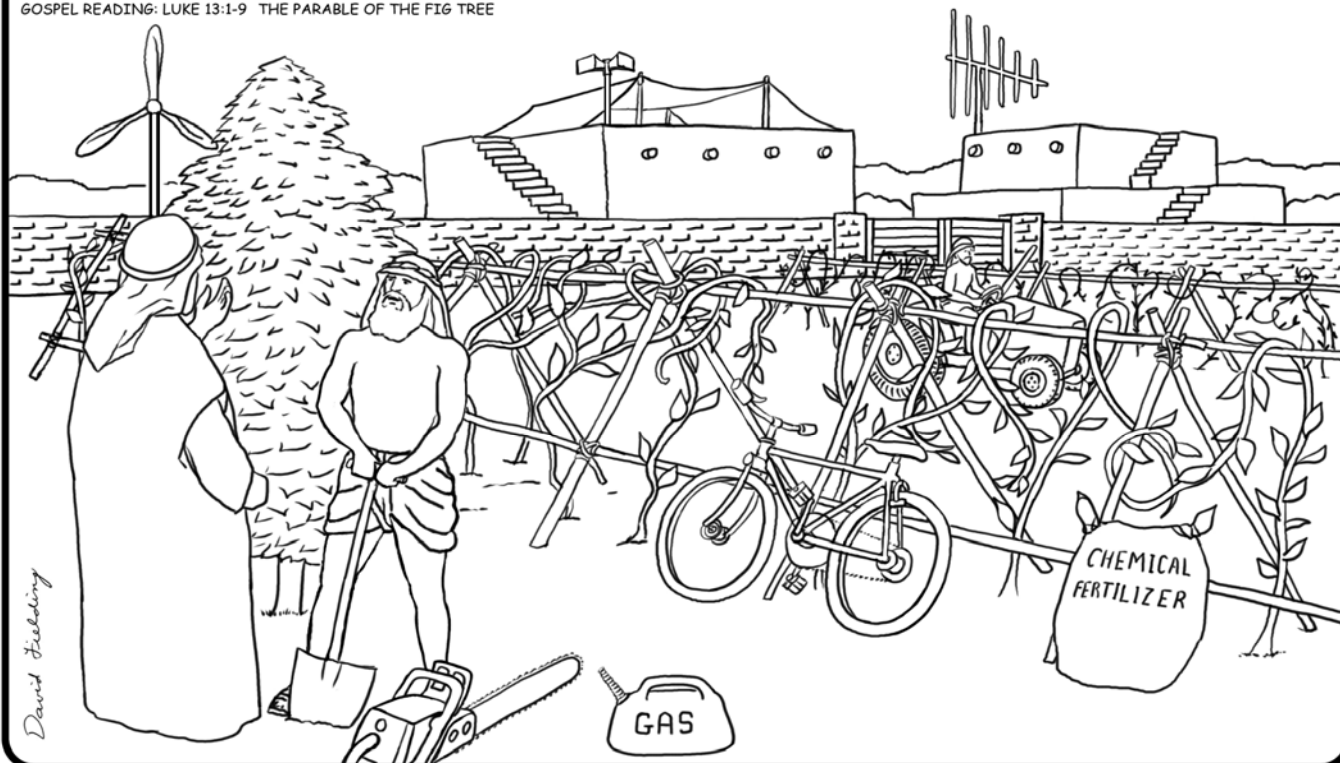
