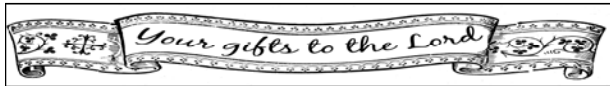

Join Fr. Michael for various meetings focusing on our Faith and our Lives. The schedule for the spring, summer and fall are as follows:

First Up: The return of the Music listening group: The Music listening group looking for God in secular music actually did manage to meet twice during the harsh winter in spite of all the snow storms. From the Pastor:

“For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead.” We might sit back and say but how is it they did not understand. He had told them of several occasions what was going to take place but they did not get it. I wonder when we look at all the Easters that we have celebrated if we can honestly say we get it. There is probably no one here who does not understand that with Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection he redeemed us from our sins, and won for us eternal life. Yet part of the meaning of the event, the victory of good over evil, is something that can be helpful for us in our everyday life.

As I reflect on the events that lead up to his being arrested, his time on the cross and his resurrection I see an important lesson for all of us.

I would like to go back to the time when Jesus presented himself to John the Baptist for baptism. At that point in his life, we believe he was thirty, he asks John to baptize him. He certainly did not need baptism due to Original Sin but I think in his being baptized he dedicated himself to the mission of the Father. I believe at this point in his life he knew he could not do what was being asked of him without the Father.

As he approaches the time of his going to Jerusalem for the celebration of the Passover he knows his time is near. He is troubled by what is before him yet he says; ““I am troubled now. Yet what should I say?

‘Father, save me from this hour’?

But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour.”

Yet as the passion is about to unfold we find him in the garden of Gethsemane praying to the Father and he says; “Abba, Father, all things are possible to you.

Take this cup away from me,
but not what I will but what you will.”

We know that as Jesus hung on the cross he gets caught up in his pain and he cries out; “My God, My God why have you abandoned me?”

Yet it is in the acceptance of the Father’s will and Jesus’ surrender, “Into your hands I commend my spirit,” that he enters into the peace of God.

I wonder if part of the resurrection message that we have yet to grasp is the one that promises us a kingdom in the here and the now. I wonder if we have not given into the temptation to do it our way instead of God’s. I wonder if we have put God’s ways secondary to those of society.

With the resurrection we celebrate how good rises above evil. In a world that is colored very much by evil would it be different if we as believers were to choose God’s ways over ours. Remember it was with the words, “Into your hands I commend my Spirit” that the resurrection was possible, that we were given the gift of eternal life. It is with these words on our lips that we will begin to receive the gift of the kingdom in the here and now.

JUDAS ISCARIOT
AND MATTHIAS

Judas Iscariot, one of the twelve apostles, betrayed Jesus at the first Easter. For thirty pieces of silver, he told the Jewish authorities where they could find Jesus and arrest him secretly.

Thirty pieces of silver was the price of a slave in those days.

Judas later returned the money, but then killed himself. Because of that, the eleven remaining apostles selected another of the early disciples, to replace Judas. This was Matthias. We know very little about him.

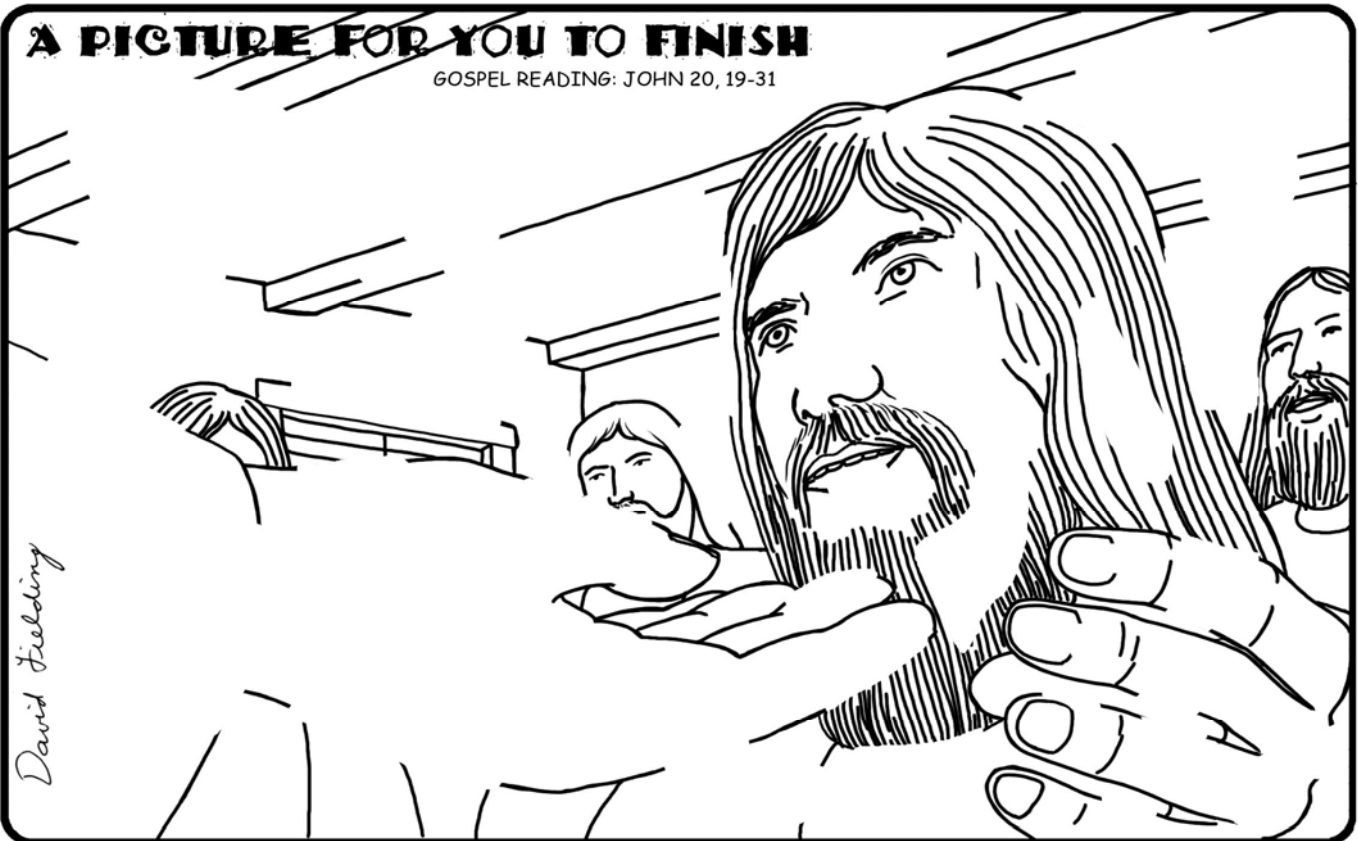

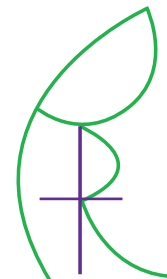
