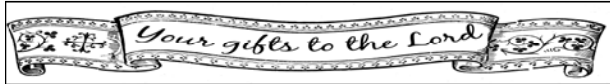

Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers Needed

There will be a training for Lectors on Thursday, April 16th at 7:30 at Blessed Sacrament Church and a training for Eucharistic Ministers on Thursday, April 30th at 7:00 p.m. at Blessed Sacrament. These are two very important ministries and you are asked to consider whether you are being called to one of them.

From the Pastor:

The story of Mary, followed by Peter and the other disciple, going to the tomb on Easter morning is an interesting gospel for us to hear on Easter Sunday. There is actually no account of the resurrection. In this passage, Jn 20:1-9, there is no apparition of the Risen Lord. What must they have thought when they arrived at the tomb? Mary states that she believes that “they have taken the Lord from the tomb and we don’t know where they put him.” The other two approach the tomb. The one, referred to as the other disciple, looks in and sees the burials cloths. Peter also sees the burial cloth but notices the cloth that covered the head was in a different place. John sums it up by saying “they did not understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

So, it would be fair to say that the lack of seeing the Risen Christ left them with doubt and confusion. Their belief in the resurrection came after each of them had actually seen the Risen Lord. Could there be a parallel between their disbelief and possibly our own position? They came to believe because they saw the Risen Lord. What is it that has brought us to the point of believing or have we made that leap of faith? Jesus says to Thomas, “you believe because you have seen, blessed are those who have not seen and have come to believe.”

For me, it has been a journey from the head to the heart. It has come about through the recognition of the active presence of God in my life; not only in helping me to achieve, do, and become but also in his helping to deal with the stuff that life deals to us, and in the recognition of the many blessings that he has bestowed on me. Amazingly this belief brings openness, hope, trust, peace, love.

For those who arrived at the tomb this day we might say it was easy but remember they lived through the death before the resurrection. For us it is a matter of looking, observing and internalizing. It is belief in the resurrected Christ that enables us to look at death and see life, to be in despair and find hope, to be in darkness and search for the light. For many of us we are on the Road to Emmaus, caught up in our own story and stuff. Let us pray that we too recognize the Risen Lord in whatever way he chooses to manifest himself to us.

May the blessings of the Easter Season and the Risen Lord be all of ours.

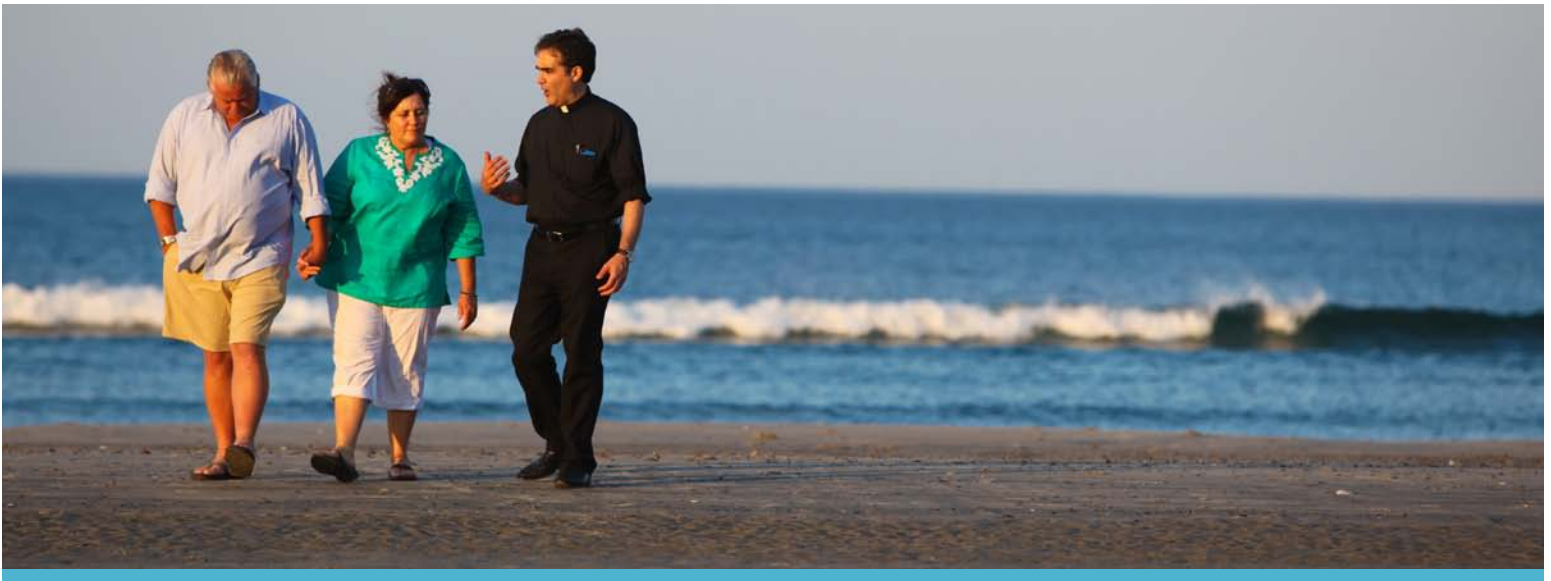
