

Happy 55th Anniversary

From the Pastor:

It is an Interesting selection of readings for the 5th Sunday of Easter. We have the post conversion story of Saul, now known as Paul and the parable of the vine and the branches. I think it would be fair to see that God looked at Saul and saw within Saul things that Saul did not recognize in himself. Remember Saul is a persecutor of the Christians, feared by all. On his way to Damascus, Saul had an encounter with Jesus that changed his life. We are told the Saul is literally knocked off his horse and thrown to the ground and is blinded by a bright light. He heard a voice that asked him why he was persecuting the Christians? Saul asked who was talking and the voice revealed himself as the Jesus whose followers he was persecuting. Paul was taken to Damascus. He was blind. Three days later, Saul was visited by Ananias, who was sent by Jesus to restore Saul's sight. Upon the restoration of his sight Saul became one of the avid followers of Jesus.

What did Jesus see in Saul? Undoubtedly he saw a good person but someone who was misguided. He saw someone who lived what he believed. He saw someone who could do great things in spreading the Christian message, the gospel of Jesus. It would be fair to say that Jesus decided that Saul needed some pruning. He chose a rather dramatic way to go about it but he saw that Paul's gifts were being misdirected. The parable tells us that God "takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and everyone that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit."

The other aspect of the story is seen in the reaction of the apostles to Paul. They knew of his reputation and they were very much afraid of Paul. They could not trust that Paul was one of them. This is similar to the rest of the conversion story of Paul. Jesus asked Ananias to go to Saul and place his hands on his head that he might see again. Ananias did not want to do this, as he feared Saul. He knew of Saul's reputation. Jesus convinced him to do it and he went to see Paul. As a result Paul's sight was restored and Paul changed his ways. In the case of the apostles it was Barnabas who took Paul in and trusted in Paul's story and helped the apostles accept and believe.

The gospel reminds us to "remain in God as God remains in us." In the story of Ananias and Paul neither one felt they could do what was asked of them. They trusted Jesus and he enabled them to accomplish what Jesus asked. In Paul's case it was through Barnabas and with Ananias it was trusting that the Lord was with him.

Where does that leave us? Some of us may have experiences where we feel that we have been knocked off our horse and others will not. God works in various ways to point out areas that are not in sync with him. Paul was doing what he believed was right, but he was wrong. The voice that Paul heard, plus the surrounding circumstances, enabled him to recognize the error of his ways. In everyone's life God speaks, he attempts to prune us as he pruned Paul. Often times there is a voice, could be within us, from someone else, something we read, something we see. This voice is calling us to see and to change. Sometimes this voice is cushioned in circumstances and we cannot see beyond what has happened to us. Sometimes the voice is lost in our own blindness and deafness. Maybe one of the lessons that is being offered to us today is let not faith be confused with certainty and blind us to the presence of God and deafen us to his voice.

THE APOSTLES: JUDE THADDAEUS

One of Jesus' twelve apostles was Jude, also known as Thaddaeus. He was the brother of another apostle, James; and they were both relatives (cousins) of Jesus himself.



Saint Jude wrote one of the letters in the New Testament. He preached in many areas and it is believed that he was put to death in what is now Armenia. He may have been beaten to death by a club and then beheaded. This explains why one of the symbols for Saint Jude is a club, and another is an ax or halberd. (See the illustration.)




