



From the Pastor:

Have you ever replayed in your mind what someone may have told you at one point in your life that, at the time, did not register with you? I suspect it was the case with the apostles and most likely, as we develop or deepen our relationship with God, it is the same for us. Listen to how Jesus sums up his mission in this life. "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy maybe complete." I would dare to say that this is quite the promise. Joy, not to be confused with happiness, is in my mind something that we experience rarely and briefly but it is an incredible feeling. One can only imagine what the joy of the Lord would be like but he tells us that all he has told us is so that our joy maybe complete.

Where does that leave us? It leaves me with thinking about the fleeting moments of joy. It leaves me thinking that those moments are really moments I would like more of. It leaves me thinking about what he has taught us and what is it that I honestly do not pay a lot of attention to. For instance to-day's gospel presents to us a real challenge. He not only calls us to love but he calls us to love as he has loved us. Think of what that means. Think of our warts, our dark side, our sins, things we do not want anyone to know. He knows all the above and yet loves us unconditionally.

As I was thinking about this I began to think of the older son in the story of the prodigal son. I believe he had a right to be angry. After all, the younger brother had taken off with his share of the inheritance and spent it foolishly. The younger brother comes back contrite and the father throws him a big party. The older brother, who has always done what is right and stayed with the father and worked the farm, is angry and feeling unappreciated. The father wants him to forgive. Why? Because the anger is keeping him from enjoying the party, life as it is meant to be. Think about it. We harbor feelings, justified as they maybe, but feelings that hinder us from experiencing the moments of joy that may be ours. I love the older son because I think that he embodies all of us to some degree. We all have God encouraging us, begging us, to let it go and enjoy life.

Think about what it is we may be hanging onto and think about the promise of God to us; that my joy may be in you and your joy maybe complete. Is what we are hanging onto keeping us from receiving what God wants for us?


