



# From the Pastor:

The Gospel for Trinity Sunday was one that stimulated much thought. In the gospel, Matthew 28:16-20, it states that the eleven disciples went to Galilee to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. Ordered is a very strong word. Why were they ordered to come? Secondly it states when they all saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. What did they doubt?

I wonder if their being ordered was due to the fact that they knew he was leaving them again and they did not want that to happen. So if they did not go he would not leave. Jesus knew full well what they were thinking and probably knew how they would handle the situation, left on their own. This situation reminds me of when the risen Christ first sees Mary Magdalene and she wants to hug him and he says to her; "do not cling to me as I have not yet ascended to the Father." Jesus knew that they had to let go in order to receive the Spirit.

Secondly they had witnessed so many things in their time with Jesus, the greatest being the resurrection. They had come to believe that he was the Messiah, the Son of God. Due to all they had experienced, witnessed, and heard they had come to worship him. We find them at another crossroad. He is now asking them to believe something else. He is going to the Father and he is sending them the Spirit of God who will be with them until the end of time. How can this be? Did they not understand and did they doubt this? It would stand to reason that they did, knowing their track record.

What made them believers? They had come to worship because of what they had experienced, seen, and heard.

For the eleven disciples it was a journey that we so often mention in looking at Peter, a journey from the self-proclaimed sinner to the ardent believer. Reflecting upon the journey of the disciples it brings us to look at our own journey. They worshiped but they doubted. Where are we in relationship to our belief in the Trinity? We profess a belief in it every time we bless ourselves. It is a common symbol and ritual that states that we are Christian and believers in the Triune God. They worshiped but they doubted. Does that describe us? I suspect that most of us believe in God, the Father, and that he is the source of all life. I would also say that we believe in the Incarnate Being, Jesus; that he came into the world and redeemed us through his life, death, and resurrection. I suspect that we profess a belief in the Spirit but I also suspect that there are questions, doubts, and hesitations to profess a belief in all that is attributed to him.

The amazing thing, at least in my mind, is that God knows all this and he still does it all the same. He ordered them to the mountain, he knew he could not force them to believe but he wanted them to experience his ascension and the Pentecost event that they might believe. God continues to work through his Spirit in our lives whether we recognize it or not. He wants us to believe as it is in believing that we come to that sense of peace and kingdom that he promises. Regardless of where we are, God is there for us.

They worshiped but they doubted. Is it talking about us and where do we go with it? I believe that doubt is good unless we become crippled by it. Doubt that stimulates a search for meaning and understanding is good. Do we just acknowledge doubt or deny it? Do we embrace it and look to our experiences and may be ask for the grace to believe? For it is in believing that we come to the fullness of life.


