

Does God Promise Resurrection to us?

New American Bible - Ezekiel 37: 1-13

1 The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he led me out in the spirit of the LORD and set me in the center of the plain, which was now filled with bones. 2 He made me walk among them in every direction so that I saw how many they were on the surface of the plain. How dry they were! 3 He asked me: Son of man, can these bones come to life? "Lord GOD," I answered, "you alone know that." 4 Then he said to me: Prophesy over these bones, and say to them: Dry bones, hear the word of the LORD! 5 Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: See! I will bring spirit into you, that you may come to life. 6 I will put sinews upon you, make flesh grow over you, cover you with skin, and put spirit in you so that you may come to life and know that I am the LORD. 7 I prophesied as I had been told, and even as I was prophesying I heard a noise; it was a rattling as the bones came together, bone joining bone. 8 I saw the sinews and the flesh come upon them, and the skin cover them, but there was no spirit in them. 9 Then he said to me: Prophesy to the spirit, prophesy, son of man, and say to the spirit: Thus says the Lord GOD: From the four winds come, O spirit, and breathe into these slain that they may come to life. 10 I prophesied as he told me, and the spirit came into them; they came alive and stood upright, a vast army. 11 Then he said to me: Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They have been saying, "Our bones are dried up, our hope is lost, and we are cut off." 12 Therefore, prophesy and say to them: Thus says the Lord GOD: O my people, I will open your graves and have you rise from them, and bring you back to the land of Israel. 13 Then you shall know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves and have you rise from them, O my people! 14 I will put my spirit in you that you may live, and I will settle you upon your land; thus you shall know that I am the LORD. I have promised, and I will do it, says the LORD.

From the Pastor:

In praying the gospel passage my attention was drawn toward the seed and how it grew. In reflecting on that I recalled how someone planted a seed in my life and how it grew and truly flourished. Some of this story I believe I have told before. Shortly after I was ordained I became aware that there was something missing. A friend of mine recommended that I make a retreat. Another friend of mine suggested that I make a directed retreat as opposed to a guided the retreat. The difference being that a guided retreat is one in which you attend different presentations offered by the retreat director. The directed retreat is one in which you meet on a one-to-one basis with the director to discuss your prayer. The directed retreat also takes place in an atmosphere of complete silence. The only talking for the week is with your director. When she described what the directed retreat was all about I immediately said that would never happen. She never mentioned it again. I suspect like St. Monica she never gave up praying that it would happen. Three years after she first mentioned it I signed up for my first directed retreat. Still somewhat hesitant about it I signed up for a period short of a week. I have to say that that experience was a changing point in my life. What I experienced on that retreat was the beginning of a relationship with God and I wanted more. I think I have made a full directed retreat every year for about 41 years and was fortunate enough to be able to make the Ignatian 30-day retreat in the mid-eighties. What grew from these experiences was a deeper relationship with God, a love for Spirituality and the eventual pursuit of a Masters Degree in Christian Spirituality.

As in the gospel the seed was planted. For three years I did not act on it but the seed, unknown to me was developing. It emerged with my signing up for the first directed retreat, even though I was not surrendering control as I dictated how long I was going to stay. I have to admit by the end of it I regretted not signing up for the full 8 days. The results of the experience grew into my ongoing desire for more. That seed that was planted has not only been a source of spiritual growth in others but a source of great fulfillment in me.

I offer this story for us to ponder in thanksgiving for the sower of the seeds in our life that has led us to a sense of fulfillment and peace and to look to opportunities presented to us to plant seeds in others. The beauty of the story I think is the fact she planted seed in my life and handed it over to God. Often times when we feel someone would benefit from something; we not only plant the seed but we hammer the point home and occasionally drive the person in the opposite direction. She never brought it up again. I believe she trusted that if it were right for me God would help it to happen when the time was right.
