A Message from the Pastor

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ June 7, 2015

Dear parishioners,

This Sunday the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**. Also known as *Corpus Christi*, this special observance draws our attention to a central belief of our Catholic faith: in the sacrifice of the Mass, the gifts we offer of bread and wine truly and really become the Body and Blood of our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Some people do not realize that each of the elements contains the fullness of the Eucharist – in other words, if for whatever reason one is receiving only the Host, or only the Precious Blood, one is still receiving the fullness of Holy Communion.

Attending Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation is the very first precept of the Church. Along with the other precepts, the obligation “is meant to guarantee to the faithful the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2041).

Today’s Solemnity seems a good occasion to recall the proper way to prepare and receive Communion. We are to abstain from food or drink (except water or medicine) for one hour before receiving Holy Communion (*Code of Canon Law*, 919). This is meant to provide spiritual preparation and encourage respect for the sacrament. We are taught that we should be in a state of grace, without mortal sin (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1415). If you are aware that you are not properly prepared, consider that the prompting of the Holy Spirit that it is a good time to go to the Sacrament of Confession.

When coming forward in the Communion procession, it is helpful to be joining in the singing the Communion hymn as a way to be prayerfully engaged in what is happening. Of course, one should not be chewing gum or have candy in one’s mouth during Mass and especially if one is about to receive Holy Communion. When ready to receive, make a reverent and profound bow while the person in front of you is receiving (for both forms). If receiving in the hand, please have nothing else in your hands, and one held under the other – like a throne for Christ our King. If receiving in the mouth, after responding “Amen” please open your mouth wide and be sure your tongue is extended to receive the Host. If not receiving from the chalice, a modest bow of the head is a sign of reverence as you pass it.

You may have noticed that at many Masses, the Communion line on the confessional side of the church does not begin immediately. This is because the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion on that side will first go to

This is completely run by volunteers and during the past year many of our volunteers have moved on to other ministries and we unfortunately cut back on the number of times that we were able to offer this great program.
