Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we encounter readings that draw us into the mystery of suffering and death. In the past few years we have witnessed the devastation of life and property through tsunamis and hurricanes. So many lifted their lament to God, simply asking, "Why?" This is an honest expression of anger toward a God who we believe is the giver of life. When we lose a loved one, we can wonder why the presence of Christ is not enough to make that person rise, even from death, as did the little girl in today's Gospel passage. Again we raise our voices and ask, "Why?" At moments such as these, let us make the prayer of the psalmist our own: "Hear, O Lord, and have pity on me; O Lord, be my helper." Let us pray that our mourning will one day be turned into dancing.

MIRACLES

Each week at Mass we gather to celebrate the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. First we listen to the great stories of our faith proclaimed in the scripture readings. Often, as is the case today, we hear stories of miracles. Then, each week, we witness a miracle repeated every time we come together for Mass. In faith, we experience the transformation of simple elements of bread and wine into the very body and blood of Christ. This miracle is no less powerful than the miracle we hear in today's Gospel. Too often we allow the power of the liturgy to wash over us. In short, we can miss the potential the miracle of the Eucharist holds for each and every one of us.

EXPECTING MIRACLES AT MASS

We can cultivate an "expecting miracles" attitude each time we celebrate Mass. We need look no further than the two people in today's Gospel for our inspiration. Jairus, the synagogue official, expects that Jesus, simply by laying hands on Jairus' daughter, will cure her. The woman with the hemorrhages expected healing: "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured" (Mark 5:28). When we come to Mass, we need to ask God to give us the strength of faith that these two people exhibited. If we are in despair over a broken relationship, let us not be afraid to seek the miracle of healing and comfort from the Lord. If a loved one is sick, let us have the courage to ask the Lord for healing. Let us not be afraid to place our lives--our woes, disappointments, and failures--on the sacred altar along with the gifts of bread and wine. Then, like Jairus and the woman with the hemorrhages, let us expect that the miracle of the transformation of bread and wine will transform our lives and bring us new life and renewed hope. What a Difference a Dress (or suit) Can Make!

The Office of Development and Stewardship organized the second annual collection for Communion dresses and suits to help families in need in our four counties. Over 400 dresses and 220 suits were donated and distributed to children throughout the Archdiocese in time for their First Holy Communion. Sixteen parishes participated by organizing a collection and “Little Nikki’s,” located in Ho-Ho-Kus, donated a dozen brand new dresses and purses. We also receive several monetary donations to purchase outfits for the children which made it possible to purchase dresses in specific sizes and several pairs of shoes. Communications were sent to all parishes and parishes and schools informing them of the communion outfit drive.

This year I was moved to tears by a mom that requested an outfit for her child. She is battling cancer and her husband recently had a heart attack. Thanks to all the donations we received I was able to deliver an outfit. I was even able to purchase a new pair of shoes for her child, thanks to the monetary donations. When I told her we had the size she needed for her child she replied, “You are my life saver”. I told her I’m just the delivery person....and the thanks belong to all the parishes that organized a collection and all the parishioners that donated a new or used outfit and sent in monetary donations. It truly is team work. It’s amazing what happens when people come together.
