Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz of Louisville, Kentucky, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) issued the following statement:

Regardless of what a narrow majority of the Supreme Court may declare at this moment in history, the nature of the human person and marriage remains unchanged and unchangeable. Just as *Roe v. Wade* did not settle the question of abortion over forty years ago, *Obergefell v. Hodges* does not settle the question of marriage today. Neither decision is rooted in the truth, and as a result, both will eventually fail. Today the Court is wrong again. It is profoundly immoral and unjust for the government to declare that two people of the same sex can constitute a marriage.

The unique meaning of marriage as the union of one man and one woman is inscribed in our bodies as male and female. The protection of this meaning is a critical dimension of the "integral ecology" that Pope Francis has called us to promote. Mandating marriage redefinition across the country is a tragic error that harms the common good and most vulnerable among us, especially children. The law has a duty to support every child's basic right to be raised, where possible, by his or her married mother and father in a stable home.

Jesus Christ, with great love, taught unambiguously that from the beginning marriage is the lifelong union of one man and one woman. As Catholic bishops, we follow our Lord and will continue to teach and to act according to this truth.

I encourage Catholics to move forward with faith, hope, and love: *faith* in the unchanging truth about marriage, rooted in the immutable nature of the human person and confirmed by divine revelation; *hope* that these truths will once again prevail in our society, not only by their logic, but by their great beauty and manifest service to the common good; and *love* for all our neighbors, even those who hate us or would punish us for our faith and moral convictions.

Lastly, I call upon all people of good will to join us in proclaiming the goodness, truth, and beauty of marriage as rightly understood for millennia, and I ask all in positions of power and authority to respect the God-given freedom to seek, live by, and bear witness to the truth.

July 12, 2015

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick – no food, no sack, no money in their belts." (MARK 6:8)

How different we are from the Apostles who took nothing when they ventured out to serve God. Today, we make our journey through life more difficult because of all the material baggage that we drag along. Yet, the more we can let go of, the freer we are to serve God with love and joy.



YOUTH NEWS

Mini Family Bible Study

Reading: 1 John 3:14-18

Read through the complete passage to start then go through the verses asking questions such as:

v. 14-15 'We know that we have passed out of death into life, because we love the brethren. He who does not love remains in death. Anyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him.'

Questions: What kind of death is St. John talking about here? What is the difference between physical and spiritual death? What is more important physical or spiritual health? How can we tell when we are spiritually "sick" when the signs aren't as tangible as physical sickness? What is St. John referencing when he says "anyone who hates his brother is a murderer"?

v. 16 'By this we know love, that He laid down His life for us; and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren.'

Questions: Christ died for us on the cross but before that He laid down His life for us every day by dedicating His life to spreading the Good News. How can we live like Jesus in this regard in our everyday life?

v. 17-18 'But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or speech but in deed and in truth.'

Questions: How do we usually address the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of others? How can we better show our love through our actions and our lives?
