#### From the Pastor

A couple of things. . .

- The scriptures from today's Mass feature major Biblical figures being led by God in ways that they would have not gone without His direction. From the first book of the Bible, Genesis, we hear today of Abram (later "Abraham") who is led from the land of his ancestors into the unknown new land where he will become the father of countless generations of his offspring. Then, in the gospel, we see Jesus, God with Us, leading his disciples up a mountain where Jesus is transfigured and reveals God's glory to his followers. In faith, we believe God led these biblical figures along His way. Of course, we wonder: how does God lead us today? And, assuming He does, how do we discover how and where God is leading us in our lives?
- The great expert among our Christian tradition about discovering the direction into which God might be leading us in our lives is St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the religious order called the Society of Jesus, AKA "the Jesuits." I've been reading about Ignatius (from his own writings) during these last weeks and expect to continue to do so as the focus of my Lenten reading. While a presentation of his theory of discovering ("discerning") God's will not fit comfortably in the approximately 600 words that comprise this weekly column, I can offer a couple comments that might be helpful if you are looking for direction—and who isn't? For Ignatius, the bottom line is that discernment of God's direction is IMPOSSI-BLE without prayer. We may not lament, therefore, that we don't understand God's ways if we are not regular and faithful in our prayer. In our tradition, prayer comes in two major forms: public prayer and private prayer. Preeminent among public prayer is the Mass. ("Public" does not mean merely praying where others can see us. The word has its root in the Latin word "publicus," meaning "of the people." Public prayer indicates when we pray together as God's people.) Our private prayer is when we pray alone. Both types of prayer are necessary.
- Assuming we're praying, about what should we pray if we are discerning God's direction in our lives? First, St. Ignatius suggests that the best way to prayerfully discern God's direction in our lives is simply to ask Him to show you. It was his experience and the experience of many Christians that sometimes God simply shows us his direction—and when He does, it is so clear that we have complete confidence in this. So, when looking for God's direction in our lives, begin by simply asking God to show you His way. God's showing us is much different that our figuring out His path for us.
- Second, sometimes God's ultimate direction is not as clear. If we have not been given the confidence of God telling us the way, we are then prayerfully to consider and to weigh our options and ask for the desire to take the next step towards His direction. In this, we are not shown our final destination, but just our next step. Then, we prayerfully consider the next step and ask for direction. We must be ready that this might be a process of "two steps forward, one step back." As is often said, "God writes straight with crooked lines." Or, as the prophet Isaiah said long ago, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways. . . . For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, my thoughts higher than your thoughts" (Is. 55:8-9). In the end, in faith we are confident that when we are looking for direction, #GodSatisfies.




This past year, St.

#### #GodSatisfies - Our Need for Direction

In this early stage of our Lenten journey, we receive a preview of transfigured life given to Jesus. In the Gospels, the Transfiguration account appears after the first of three references about Jesus' suffering and death. Jesus bluntly informs his followers that their journey to Jerusalem will lead to his arrest and execution. Jesus immediately adds that his disciples must also surrender themselves to God's way of salvation. True discipleship demands imitating Jesus' willingness to give up this present life for greater life. Immediately after this fearsome call, Peter, James, and John, who will also accompany Jesus in Gethsemane, receive a vision of glorious life brought out by death. In the midst of this revelation of what is to come, the disciples are called to "listen to him." In what ways do you feel directionless? How can this vision of the Transfiguration encourage you when you feel directionless?


