Dear Friends,

A few weeks ago I spoke of Catholic Schools and our faith. I told you of my experience at the graduation of Our Lady of Lourdes High School and how proud I was of the students I knew there who were graduating. I was recently speaking with a friend who had two children that went to St. Mary's in Fishkill and Lourdes High School. She said that, as she looks at her two children attending college, she was so confident that the Catholic Schools that her children attended made all the difference in the world.

It is especially difficult for us out here in Eastern Dutchess since we have no Catholic schools in our area. Parents who want a Catholic School education for their children have to go to Poughkeepsie or other surrounding locations. It may seem useless for me to extol and praise Catholic schools since they are quite a distance from us. It is a dream, that for us in Amenia and Millerton, is so far away. I could speak of the struggle of getting any kind of help from the government of the State of New York. Recently a very moderate law proposed to help Catholic and private schools didn't make it into legislation. It was a law that was very modest, with tax help for parents of private-school students, but it appears there are forces in government that don't want this kind of thing to happen. That is too bad.

I have spoke many times of my love for Catholic Schools. I served at Sacred Heart School in Suffern, St. Mary's School in Fishkill and St. John's School in Goshen. They are very special places of which I have very fond memories. I hope and pray that there will be, someday, Catholic Schools that are growing and opening all over our great Archdiocese.

**MEN'S CLUB** - The next Men's Club meeting will be held on Monday, July 7<sup>th</sup>, at 6:45 pm in the Chapel of Immaculate Conception Church in Amenia.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO HAVE A MASS "OFFERED" FOR SOMEONE - An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as a birthday, an anniversary, or for someone who is ill or in distress), or as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul. Please keep in mind that the tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, originates in the very early Church. Inscriptions discovered on tombs in Roman catacombs of the 2<sup>nd</sup> century evidence this practice. St. Cyril of Jerusalem (d.386), in one of his many catechetical discourses, explained how at Mass both the living and dead are remembered, and how the Eucharistic Sacrifice of our Lord is of benefit to sinners, living and dead. St. Ambrose (d.397) preached, "We have loved them during life; let us not abandon them in death, until we have conducted them by our prayers into the house of the Lord." When we face the death of someone, even a person who is not Catholic, to have a Mass offered for the repose of their soul and to offer our prayers are more beneficial and comforting than any sympathy card or bouquet of flowers. To have Mass offered on the occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need is appropriate, beneficial and much appreciated. (Fr. William Saunders)
