## *"FIRST COMMUNION"*

Dear Friends:

In the next few weeks, I would like to share with you my experiences in this wonderful vocation they call the priesthood. They may be stories about me, but they are really stories about all of us and about our beloved community, the Church.

First Communion celebrations are great experiences. But sometimes people go a little too far in their excitement. Many of us know of extravagant First Communion outfits. I experienced one where a girl had a beautiful veil that actually had little lights on it. Her mother had a remote control where she would turn the lights on and off at a distance.

One surprising experience I had was when I was invited to a First Communion party. It was in the evening, at a fancy reception hall, with 100 guests and a live band. There was a full dinner and dancing (remember this is a First Communion party). When we left, we received a t-shirt that said "I danced the night away at Jennifer's First Communion." I still have it. When I told another priest about this he said, "What are they going to do for her Confirmation, go on a cruise?"

I really have to say, honestly, I have never seen 7 and 8 year olds as happy as at their First Communion. And it's more than the party, or the gifts, or the attention. To me, it is a sign of the magnificence of the sacrament. I may be idealistic, but I still think that First Communion is so special, and our children know it. What a privilege and a joy it is to experience it with them.
