"THE MISSIONS"

Dear Friends:

The recent visit of Brother Jim Adams to our parish for the annual collection for the Propagation of the Faith prompted me to reflect on a few things.

We have a great number of collections in the American Church for the missions, and perhaps we wonder where are all those resources going to.

I mention sometimes the emerging understanding of the Church's mission as the "new evangelization." Evangelization is the bringing of the gospel into the world. The "new" evangelization brings a new awareness of the world as it is today. The world today is a different place. Many of the traditional structures of religion in our world, especially in America and Europe, have been marginalized or have disappeared. Society used to support religion in many ways. We can remember how society supported the parish, supported marriage, supported a religious role in public life.

Unfortunately, that has changed. Religion, including the Catholic Church, has been pushed to the sidelines. Communities in Europe and America are less committed to helping religious groups. Modern society is not as concerned with God as before. Catholic education is not supported as before – families have to fight to get religious education even tolerated by public officials.

So all of that means a new effort: a "new evangelization," to get religion back into our modern world. It is a different place; we must increase our efforts and resources to support this new challenge. Supporting the missions now includes the "missions" in our own communities.

There is a very bright spot in this difficult work of the missions. This amazing occurrence is happening and many of us don't know about it. It is the incredible success of the mission lands in creating their own bishops, clergy, sisters and churches. 50 years ago it seemed that no native peoples would ever become Bishops, Priests or Sisters. Since then, there has been an explosion of "native" clergy. There are so many priests and sisters from mission countries that they are now coming here to the U.S. to help us!
