My Friends.

This week we begin our 40-day Lenten observance with our Ash Wednesday liturgies. This year the 12:15 liturgy will be a Mass instead of a Liturgy of the Word. Masses will also be celebrated at 8:30am and 7:00pm. The regulations for fast and abstinence are contained in this week's bulletin. We will have Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 1pm with the school and at

In this season, we are called to prayer, fasting and almsgiving as a remedy for sin. As Pope John Paul II has pointed out, there is so much in our society that manifests a 'culture of death.' I would ask that as a parish family, we join with other churches throughout the United States in '40 Days of Prayer for Life.' It is in a concerted effort of persistent prayer that change can come about. Remember back on all those years we prayed the rosary for the conversion of Russia? I don't know how you would measure it, but I wouldn't be surprised if the Russian people are more religious today than we are! Do not underestimate the importance of prayer for the conversion of the heart that Jesus calls us to in the gospel.

Again, as a parish, we will participate in Catholic Relief Service's *Operation Rice Bowl*. When we fast by eating a simple meal the money we save provides funds to feed those who are poor and hungry. This is a great way to observe Lenten practices of fasting and almsgiving as a family. I also would encourage you to read the Bible together as a family. We share so little time together any more. When we do it is usually through technology. We do not relate to one another on a personal level. Our Lenten theme is: 'If today you hear his voice, harden not your heart.' There will be hearts at the church entrances with this inscription on the 1st Sunday of Lent. While they can be very therapeutic for relieving stress, I hope they serve as a reminder to soften our hearts to receive the grace and love of God.

FASTING and ABSTINENCE TP

Ash Wednesday, March 5th and Good Friday, April 18th are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast that is limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday.
