My Friends,

During this past week our Lenten reflection centered on reconciliation. Our cluster Parish Mission focused our attention on the Sacrament of Reconciliation that was celebrated throughout the diocese on Wednesday. The first step in deepening one's spirituality is the admission of our sinfulness. If we can't own up to our sinfulness, there really is no need of a redeemer. It is so easy to rationalize away our sins. As a result, we fail to appreciate the depth of the Lord's love and mercy for us. We need to continue this journey of faith of opening our hearts to the grace of God's forgiveness.

This week, Bishop Gries will join us as we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. We seek to empty our hearts of the selfish ego so that we are free to allow the Spirit of God to flourish and permeate our whole being. This is the grace we are praying for this week for our young people who will be confirmed. It is a critical time in their spiritual development. The culture promotes self-absorption. Yet they are called to sacrifice the self in service of the other. They need our encouragement and our prayer. We ask God's blessing upon them and pray that the Spirit may truly be the guiding force in their lives.

As the Spirit calls us to ministry, more often than not it is one of 'untying the knots.' Pope Francis almost pleads with us to let go of all that binds us in sin so as to be free to love and live in the life of God. This is the ministry of the Church. As the coming synod on the family will explore ways to restore marriage and family life, a major concern will be the ministry for those who have suffered through a divorce. The annulment procedure seeks to preserve the sanctity of the Sacrament of Marriage while still allowing for the reconciliation of those who are divorced. Again, the Cleveland Tribunal is offering its 'First Steps' program to explain and assist those who would like to reconcile their marriage. There will be a meeting at St. Peter's in Lorain on March 25<sup>th</sup> at 7pm. I highly recommend it for anyone who has suffered through a divorce.

One last footnote: The Pastoral Council will be discerning its new members for the coming year. We welcome any parishioner who may be interested in serving on the council to contact the parish office. You are also welcome to nominate someone whom you may think would serve well on the council. (Please let them know you are nominating them before you call their name into the office.)
