My Friends,

This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it! In a world fraught with bad news, it is hard not to grow cynical about the future. We are skeptical of any 'good deed' and despair of any way out of this morass. I have to think that the disciples of Jesus shared these same emotions as they laid their hope in the tomb. But the good news this Easter Sunday morning is that death is not the end nor can it destroy the hope that is ours in Christ. He is risen and opened the way for us to share in his resurrection and a life of love in the Father's Kingdom.

Everyone has their own pet theory on why the world is coming apart at the seams. I would submit that once we take God out of the picture in this secular world, death rules. What is left except eat, drink and be merry because tomorrow we die. The resurrection is the heart of Christian belief. St. Paul writes in his letter to the Corinthians: "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all." The resurrection of Christ opens up the possibility of a whole transcendent way of being. I'm not sure people of faith are convicted in this belief. It would have to change the way we live our life.

Society's basic ethic, contrary to the Christian gospel, is all about self-preservation. We need more guns to protect our assets. After all, I worked hard for everything I own and it is there to serve me. Somehow I have not located this sentiment in the gospel. We protest that we are a Christian nation but as Pope Francis has proposed, there are some serious challenges. In the Christian perspective, all we have is a gift from God. When we speak of the resurrection of the body, we are talking the whole Body of Christ. We cannot segregate the parts. We need to be connected in love with one another. This is the purpose of Sunday Eucharist. We are to become one body. Yet so many do not feel drawn to this deeper intimacy in Christ.

I have some good news for you! Jesus Christ is risen! I wish there were a better market for good news in today's culture. Still we may need to do a better job of proclaiming it in our lives. Let's center our hope on the risen Lord and then see what kind of world tomorrow brings. Pope Francis is already showing us the way!
