My Friends,

While some may question the Catholic tradition of honoring the saints, the celebration of the canonization of St. Pope John XXIII and St. Pope John Paul II had to stir the hearts of even those who have no belief. One could not help but be inspired by the incredible joy and love that was shared by people from all over the world in St. Peter's Square. This is what the life of faith is all about. Our belief in the Lord's resurrection draws us into the vortex of the Father's love.
