

# FROM FR. KEN:

This week is Catholic Schools Week. Within the Catholic Church we have had a long history of education, so when I hear the false phrase that the Church is against science I just have to laugh because we have been teaching and encouraging science for years. Copernicus was a cleric of the Church, which means he received minor orders, it is not certain whether or not he was ordained a priest. Gregor Mendel, an Augustinian Friar, was a pioneer of modern genetics; Fr Georges Lemaitre was the one who proposed the Hubble Constant (the big bang theory.) The Catholic Church has been doing formal education of students from the second century, a very long tradition. In Creston, the monks at St Malachy started teaching students in 1870 (Creston became incorporated in 1869) and we have been continuing to do so since then. Currently there are about 2 million students in the 6,500+ Catholic schools in this country and at current spending rates would add over \$28 billion to the nationwide school spending. St Malachy Catholic School has been open for over 145 years due to the support and sacrifice of so many. Parents sacrifice financially to send their children to the school with their tuition payments, and other help of time, talent, and treasure. Teachers, faculty, and administration give because their salary could be higher by working for other educational systems. Parishioners, other family, and friends help by donating funds, supporting fundraisers, and the many other events that go on in the school. We have also been blessed by bequests from those who have passed away, most recently from Dorothy Peak. We are also supported by a wonderful tax credit program called CTO which supports our students and offers a 65% state tax credit to the donors. We hope that with continued prayers and support we can continue to have a wonderful as well as a prayerful school for another 145 years.
