

FROM FR. KEN

At the end of this week the children hear one of the favorite phrases "It is spring break!" As a child, I remember looking forward to the breaks and holiday seasons, to the time off, as an adult, I miss those days. I was a typical child and did not like going to school, except for the time that I got to spend with my friends. There are many times in which I wish that I could go back to that time, where I did not have to deal with the responsibilities as an adult. Being someone who was a "delayed vocation" to the priesthood, I had the opportunity to go back to full time school as an adult with the experiences of the responsibilities of home ownership, it is something that those who went to seminary straight out of high school did not have, but each of us has our own path and if it is where God wants us to be, we should follow it. In seminary I heard the phrases "I can't wait to get out of school and to work" or "I can't wait to be a pastor." Yes it is good to plan for the future, and yes it is good to be reminded of the memories we have from the past, but nothing we can do can change what happened in the past or go back to it, we can only use those experiences to help us plan for the future, for where God is calling us to be.
