

FROM FR. KEN

This weekend we finish what is called the Octave of Easter, the first week of the Easter Season. It concludes with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. This is a newer feast day that was instituted by St. John Paul II that focuses on the incredible mercy that God offers us. This is based on the writing of St. Faustina Kowalska and her vision of Jesus who came to her. This is what she wrote in her diary: "In the evening, when I was in my cell, I became aware of the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand was raised in blessing, the other was touching the garment at the breast. From the opening of the garment at the breast there came forth two large rays, one red and the other pale. In silence I gazed intently at the Lord; my soul was overwhelmed with fear, but also with great joy. After a while Jesus said to me, 'paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the inscription: Jesus, I trust in You." This image that came to St. Faustina is one that she painted and is now known all over the world with the red and the white representing the blood and the water that came from His side. This Sunday at Holy Spirit Church we are celebrating the Divine Mercy with Adoration and Confessions starting at 2:00 PM and lasting until just before 3:00 in which we will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy followed by Benediction and Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament. This is a wonderful time to just sit and reflect in front of the Blessed Sacrament. His mercy is far greater than anything that we can image and Jesus wants us to leave our sins with Him. I would invite everyone to spend some time this Sunday with our Lord reflecting on His Divine Mercy.

Capital Campaign for School addition: The revised plans have just been received. They will be given to an independent estimator to see if the cost is below 1.2 million dollars. If over we cannot afford to proceed. Food Fair: Lisa Miller will continue helping. We have had some others interested so jobs can be divided and not so much work on the chairpersons. The Council voted not to have a bake sale booth. This allows people to bake for a food booth. Date is September 10 and time will be shortened. Serving from 4:00-6:30 p.m. We have to make sure each booth has enough food to serve that length of time. Cost will remain the same \$8 for 5 punches. Ambrose Estate Sale: The date is May 13th. New Business: Karen Walter, Karen Struble and Mark O'Riley's term will end June 30th. We will place a note in the bulletin seeking volunteers to serve.
