

FROM FR. KEN

Questions, questions, who has questions? We all question some things, sometimes it is part of our natural human response to question things. Asking questions about the faith is something else that is good to do, but we do need to seek out the answer. When we ask questions and seek out the reasons behind the issue we have, we may not always agree with the reason, but then we can understand why. Some very famous Catholic writers began with simply asking a question and this question led them to write. One of the most prolific writers in our Church was St Thomas Aquinas. He wrote the couple of thousand page work, the Summa Theologica based on one simple question, "who is God?" When he was finished with it he stated that it was all straw and should be burned because he could not explain God. Even though St. Thomas realized that he could not explain or prove the existence of God, it does not mean that the work that he did was in vain. It is only in seeking that we can find and the beginning question led St. Thomas on the journey of trying to discover God, and in the end even though he could not fully answer the question it still led him to a closer relationship with God. He questioned the faith and in looking for answers deepened it and so can we.

PARISH COUNCIL RECAP

The Council met Tuesday, January 17th. Organization report was from the CCW: 40 women have paid their dues; fabric for the recovering of the church pews has been ordered but has not come in; the CCW paid for the cleaning of the hall carpet; December's meeting was a potluck with music provided by St. Malachy 5th grade. Old Business: We will get two more bids for the demolishing of the old ReRun Shop. Soliciting will soon begin on the capital campaign for the addition to St. Malachy School. We will be applying for several grants to help fund this project. The goal is to begin ground work this summer. The float in the Christmas parade came together well with 15 to 20 kids participating. New Business: 2017 Food Fair was discussed. Committee Reports: Building/Safety/Grounds: The need for an altar railing was stressed. Work is being done in the sacristy with cleaning of the wood, patching holes, painting, etc. The west storage room needs to be reorganized. The need for a small flat bed trailer for the parish was discussed. Family Life: Coffee and rolls served last Sunday; will serve again February 19th. Newcomer packet to Michael Brennan was distributed. Social Concerns: Giving tree was well received. Food pantry is growing. Christmas Dinner was successful with approximately 150 meals served, delivered or taken out. Monetary donations received for the Christmas dinner that were not spent go into the parish's needy fund account. Liturgy: Great help in decorating the church for Christmas. Finance: ReRun Shop is doing very well and a huge asset to the school's budget. The parish and Calvary Cemetery were named in Roberta Ambrose's estate. We are in year three of the diocesan capital campaign. Faith Formation: Advent Activity night well attended; 8th grade retreat is March 12th; Confirmation retreat date will soon be set. February 19th is First Eucharist Parent Meeting. The school now has 1 to 1 ratio of computers and students. Jan Lesan is the new PE teacher. FACTS tuition program will be used in all diocesan schools next year. CRHP women's retreat has been postponed.
