

FROM FR. KEN

This week we celebrate a couple of big feast days, the Solemnities of All Saints and All Souls days. While they seem somewhat similar they are really pretty different. On the feast of All Saints, we are honoring those people who have gone before us and are in the kingdom of heaven. We are asking them for prayers to God for us. Sacred Scripture talks about the countless Holy Ones that surround the throne of heaven and these are the unnamed saints that are in heaven. We have the two kinds of saints, the first kind are the ones that the Church proclaims as saints; no, the Church does not make them saints, God does, we just acknowledge it by the evidence of their lives, and the second kind of saints are those good and holy people, what I call the Aunt Marthas of the world. On the other side, on All Souls Day, we pray for those people who have died asking God to take them into heaven, so in essence, we pray for the souls to become saints! Both of these days are special days for each of us because we hope to one day to be a part of the second, and then the first groups. I remember a priest mentor, Fr Hoefler, as he was very sick and close to death telling people to not canonize him at his funeral, but to pray for him, because he said that he needed our prayers. Yes it is a good thing to hope that our loved ones are in heaven, but we also need to pray for them. One day, and we will know the time, that our prayers should change from praying for someone to praying with them. So as we celebrate these two great days in our Church we should be reminded of those who have gone before us.
