

# DIOCESAN RENTAL USAGE

The diocese is requiring all groups and/or persons using parish facilities to sign a facility usage/indemnity agreement and provide proof of liability insurance. The agreement requires the renter of the facility to provide to the parish a certificate of insurance documenting general liability coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence. This certificate of insurance must name Holy Spirit Parish or St. Edward Parish or St. Malachy School and the Diocese of Des Moines as an additional insured. It is not adequate to obtain a certificate of insurance, which names the parish/school as a "certificate holder." If your insurance does not cover \$1,000,000 in liability insurance you may take out a special policy with Catholic Mutual for \$50.00 to cover this. Contact the parish or school office if you need this additional insurance.
