

FROM FR. KEN

This week, we celebrate Thanksgiving! For some, it is a day that we get to spend time with our family, to enjoy a good meal together. For others it is a day to eat all day long, and then watch some football, and for others now, it is a day to go to work because it has become a shopping day for others. I find it interesting that it is often called "Black Friday" which does not have a good connotation it hints at something dark and sinister, but in reality, it is the kickoff to when most of the profits are made for stores. The Parish Council met November 15th. **Organization** report was from the Knights of Columbus: They have 148 members. Working in the sacristy and getting another shelving unit in the church basement. They will be trimming trees on the west side of the cemetery. Will serve Open Table in January. Thanksgiving dinner a success with a great crew of workers. Old Business: No one has made an offer on the old ReRun building so we will move forward with demolition. Capital Campaign for School: Architect is working on mechanical plans. When those are completed we can start getting bids. New Business: Christmas Parade: Lisa Miller will be in charge of the float. Christmas Dinner: We will serve dinner again this year. Anita Studer is the chair with Barb Hudson helping. Committee Reports: Building and Grounds: Outside church railings repaired. Altar railing still needs to be added. Insurance company is requesting a log being kept for anytime snow removal is done along with when sand and salt were applied. The church roof has been repaired. Fire marshal has inspected the school. Family Life: The visit to the Huck family has been completed. Coffee and rolls will be served November 20th, not in December, and again on January 15th. Social Concerns: The Food Pantry has received their 501c3 status. St. Malachy students have been helping at the pantry. We will have a Giving Tree this Christmas. It will be up by Thanksgiving if we have received our list of families. Liturgy: Will decorate for Advent on November 25th and for Christmas after Mass on December 18th. Finance: We are holding our own. Finance Council meets November 21st. RE/Confirmation/Youth Group: All going well. First Reconciliation is November 20th. Advent Activity Night, an activity for the entire family, will be November 30. St. Malachy School Report: The students are helping with ReRun and Food Pantry. STEM night was a huge success. Muffins for Mom also very successful. CRHP: Date set for January 28th/29th. Pastor: The book Resisting Happiness by Matthew Kelly will be given out at Christmas.
