

FROM FR. KEN:

This Sunday is the feast of St Nicholas! So how do we get from celebrating the feast day of a saint to celebrating Santa Clause which began. First of all the name change, tradition holds that the Dutch first brought the saint to the Americas with the Dutch name of Sante or Sancte (saint) Claus (Nicholas) which morphed Santa Claus. The tradition holds that Nicholas who was born of wealthy parents in the late 3rd century in Patara, a village in what is now Turkey, and later became a Bishop of Myra. He had a strong faith and took to heart the words of Jesus to go and sell what you have and give to the poor. He used his whole inheritance to help the sick, the poor, and those who were suffering. He is often pictured with the staff of a bishop and three gold balls or bags of gold in his hands because the story goes that there was a poor man who had three daughters and he did not have enough for a dowry. Without a dowry, it was unlikely that the girls would be able to get married and often times ended up as slaves. On three separate occasions, Nicholas tossed bags of gold through the window for the dowries and they landed in the shoes or stockings that were set by the fire to dry. Originally gifts were left in stockings or shoes and not under a Christmas Tree, which came much later. St Nicholas was imprisoned during the persecution of the Roman Emperor Dicletian, but the prisons became so full from all of the bishops, priests, and deacons that they did not have room for the real criminals, most of the religious prisoners were released after Christianity made legal in 321.He eventually died on December 6th, 343. He was a man who was known for his generosity and love of God and is a great example for us to follow.




