

FROM FR. KEN:



They are working in the kitchen replacing/cleaning/repairing cabinet doors. Sponsoring a Men's Retreat on the 27th. Helping with the Fish Fry on the 26th. Have out doors projects lined up when spring arrives. Unfinished Business: Signs for next year's float in the Christmas parade will be furnished by the CD of A. New Business: Begin discussion on RAGBRAI Parish served homemade noodles/turkey events. with real mashed potatoes last time. Was a huge hit and will go with that again. Are looking for coordinators. Entire parish cooperation is needed. Catholics Come Home Diocesan project has started running ads on TV. Committees: Buildings/Grounds: Several projects to work on when spring arrives. Family Life: Coffee/Rolls served this weekend but not in March. Social Concerns: Committee does projects during the year, but cannot get people to come to meetings. We will add to our monthly food drive a can to collect money for the UCC's Food Bank. Food can be purchased at a minimal price. MATURA's regulations have changed and people can only receive assistance every 90 days instead of 30. They can receive help every week at UCC. Lenten Family Activity Night went well. Students helped with ministries at Ash Wednesday Mass. First Eucharist Parents meetings will begin. Several CRHP ladies continuing on.


