

FROM FR. KEN:

We have arrived at the first weekend of Lent. Again we have the three pillars of lent, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Prayer helps us to turn away from sin and turn towards God. I would recommend spending extra time in prayer, if you usually pray for a couple of minutes, set the timer on your phone for 15 min so you are not looking at the clock all the time, and spend those 15 minutes in spiritual reading, Sacred Scripture, praying the rosary, or just talking to God. Prayer is something everyone needs to do. Fasting helps us to work against our own appetites toward sin, it is about doing something out of love, it is not just about giving up chocolate, coffee, or soda. This giving up of something should bring us to a closer relationship with Christ, so every time you reach for the thing that you are giving up, say a little prayer for strength and also give thanks for the ability to do it. Almsgiving is the fight against worldly desires, there are many different opportunities for this. This something that we are constantly bombarded with. I personally receive at least 2-3 requests for money each week and as a Church we are ones who ask a lot! The thing I want to remind everyone again, is that yes, we do have a significant budget for the church and school, and we do have a good number of extra envelopes and second collection items, but they are not "required" they are simply opportunities to give to something you feel strongly about. There are so many good causes to give to, both in the Church and out, and we cannot support everything, but we can support those things we feel strongly about. Pray about those things you are doing for the Lenten season and remember that we are preparing for the coming of Christ again in the resurrection.



LENT

- All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Everyone 14 years or older must refrain from eating meat (or food containing meat).
- Mondays of Lent Holy Spirit Parish will be having Adoration from 5:00-6:00 p.m.; Mass at 6:00 p.m. with Stations of the Cross following Mass and concluding with a soup supper in the hall. During Adoration Fr. Ken will be available to hear confessions. The Catholic Daughters will be in charge of lining up the soup. Sign-up sheets will be available at the soup suppers or in the back of church if you would like to provide soup. A freewill offering is made to the Rice Bowl.
- Stations of the Cross, Friday, February 19th, 7:00 p.m., at St. Edward's Church.
- Sunday night 5:00 p.m. Ecumenical Services will be held. February 14th service will be at the Platte Center Church. Holy Spirit will host the Good Friday Service, March 25th, at noon with a light luncheon to follow.
