FROM FR. KEN

This past week, the Holy Father released the Apostolic Exhortation Amoris Laetitia or the Joy of Love. I again find it both sad and humorous how the secular media and even some Catholic media reads and interprets the documents from the Popes, especially Pope Francis. First and foremost, the Pope is NOT changing ANY dogmas or doctrines of the Church, because he cannot! Second, I would highly recommend that everyone read the document, you can download it for free from the Vatican website, I myself have started it, but am only part-way through it. I am hoping to finish it in the next week or so. The document is broken out into chapters and the introduction explains it. The first chapter sets the tone with scripture, and then there are two chapters on love, a chapter on raising children, two chapters for pastoral ministers, and some others. If you hear the media stating that "the Pope is changing X" you should always be skeptical until you read what he actually said in the context of the original document. Our current Holy Father is much more apt to talk to the media on the fly and thus will often get misquoted because our nature is to immediately pick up only on things we want to hear. The Pope again, did not say anything different than the Church has taught, he is simply saying it in a different way. He is reminding us of the importance of the family, while realizing that we are in many different situations. Families don't always get along, they don't always like each other, but no matter what happens they still love each other. We are all called to love as one true family of God because in the end, if we are all children of God the Father, and adopted brothers and sisters of God the Son, we are all really one family.
